Significant Events of 2004

2004 was the year that Branch District Library inaugurated its wireless Internet service in the technology area, and its new Outreach Service for library users unable to leave home.

Total circulation for 2004 was 175,692, a 7.6% increase overall, with the Sherwood branch showing a 27% increase!

Childrens Services

"Discover New Trails at Your Library" was the theme for 2004's summer reading program. Dr. Anson Pantz paid the children a visit as part of the program.




