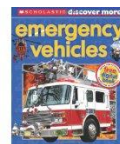

- More funding for additional programs and activities.

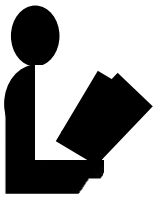

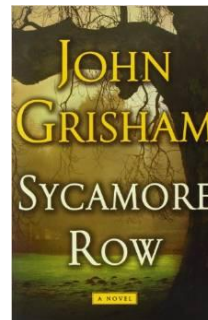
