





#### C.H.S. IN WAR TIME

This year more than ever before, perhaps, the war has been brought nearer to us and we actually see some of our classmates leave school and its protection to serve and protect their country and the things it stands for and means to them. It strikes home this year. Not only this but also the activities carried on within the school make us realize it more fully and it seems more significant than last year.

Perhaps the first change came early in the year when curricular activities were changed. Physical education became compulsory three days a week for the girls and included a period everyday of the week for the boys. It was obviously resented at first, but now it's taken as an asset to one's self as well as to our country. Although it was actually only an extension of normal school days it was broadened a great deal. The boys really had a strenuous workout in gym in order to develop their bodies through exercise. They did push-ups, sit-ups, leg-raises, rope climbing, turnovers on parallel bars, played rugby and ran long distances in all sorts of weather in order to do this. In the spring, an obstacle course was constructed which really put them through their paces.

Although the girls had somewhat of a less strenuous class two days out of the week which included sports and exercises, they nevertheless are as physically fit to take their place in the war effort as the boys. They also took a practical first-aid course to lend a helping hand if needed at any time. They will not be found unprepared.

Every now and then classes were interrupted

throughout the year by practice air-raid drills to prepare the students for actual raids.

They also did their share in the scrap drives. devoting some portion of their time to gathering all kinds of scrap. Coldwater High School is today the proud possessor of five hundred dollars worth of bonds as a result of these drives. Not content to do the job halfway or part of the time, they kept at it by investing in war stamps every Tuesday, nearly two thousand dollars worth in all. The money to invest was undoubtedly earned by working at various jobs outside of school. This enabled the release of more men and women for the more difficult jobs and for service in other branches.

Due to gas rationing, many sports were eliminated for Twin-Valley contests and other games away from home involving travel. This brought on a concentration of sports and developed into an intramural sports program carried out through the year. More came out for sports than ever before.

Parties were fewer and less luxurious than in previous years, which is to be expected. However, in spite of all these sacrifices and wartime adjustments, no less fun was had in CHS, but rather, it only stimulated us into working harder when we worked in order to relax better when we did

And so, the year 1942-43 will long be remembered as a year of fun and as a year of honest hard work toward victory.
