





Seniors Matt Waterbury and Darrell Graver made All-Conference. This is a great honor since only five members are picked out of eight teams. This was Matt's 2nd year on the All-Conference team. Matt averaged 4.33 per hole in T-V play, while Darrell averaged 5.33.

The Varsity team was made up of three seniors and two juniors.


Bret Norton picked up valuable points throughout the season and missed breaking the mile record by .2 seconds. Bret finished second in the conference mile.
