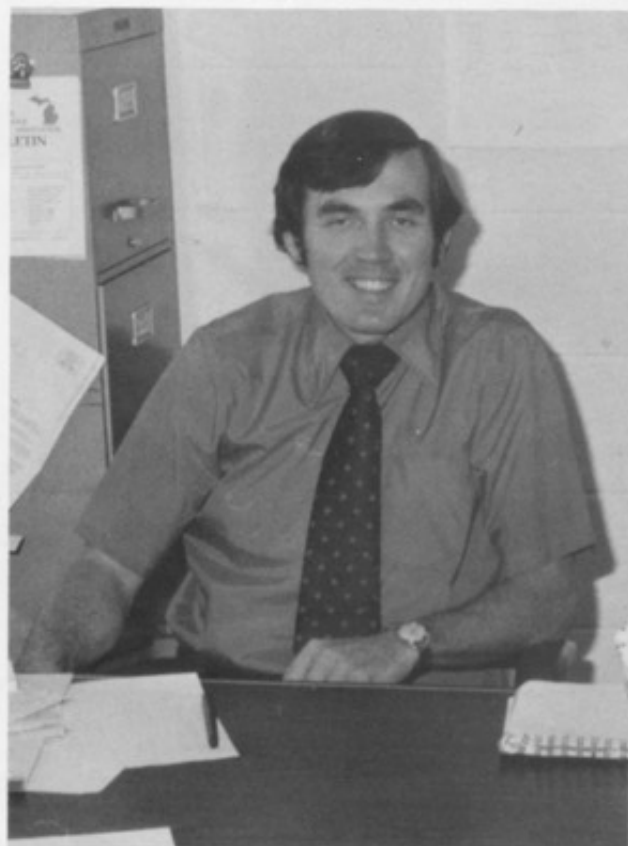
Mr. Robert Beauchamp, Mr. Warren Wade and Mr. Joseph Curelo hold the three highest offices at Bronson High School.

Switchboard Operator is a new position here this year, and Mrs. Kathy Ludwick operates our entire phone and reception system.

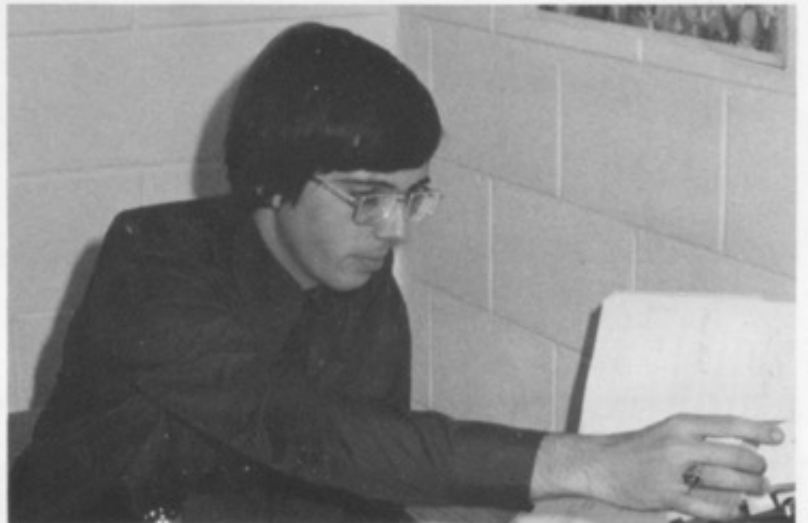

Baccalaureate services were held June 1 in the high school's gym.

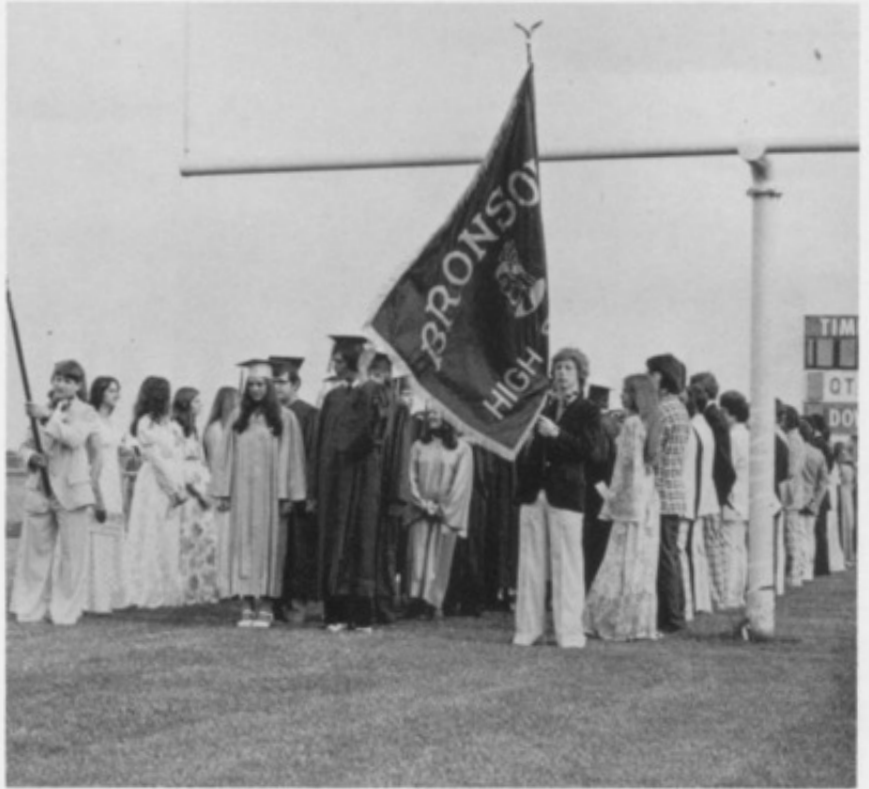

Your teachers say come back and see them. And you know you won't.

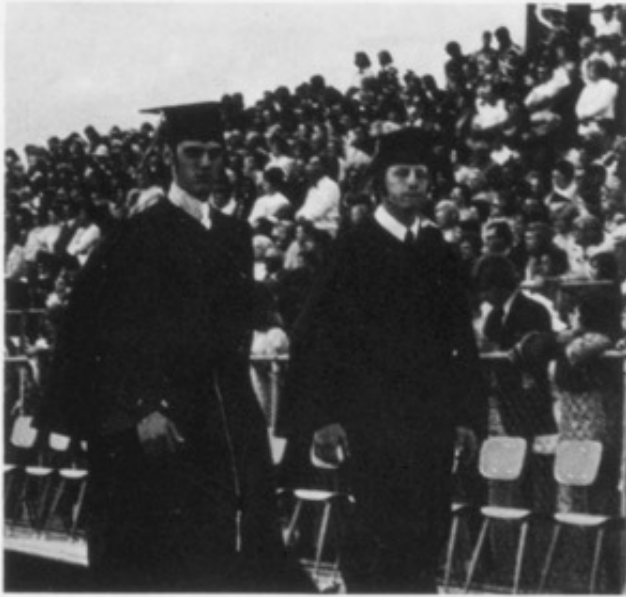

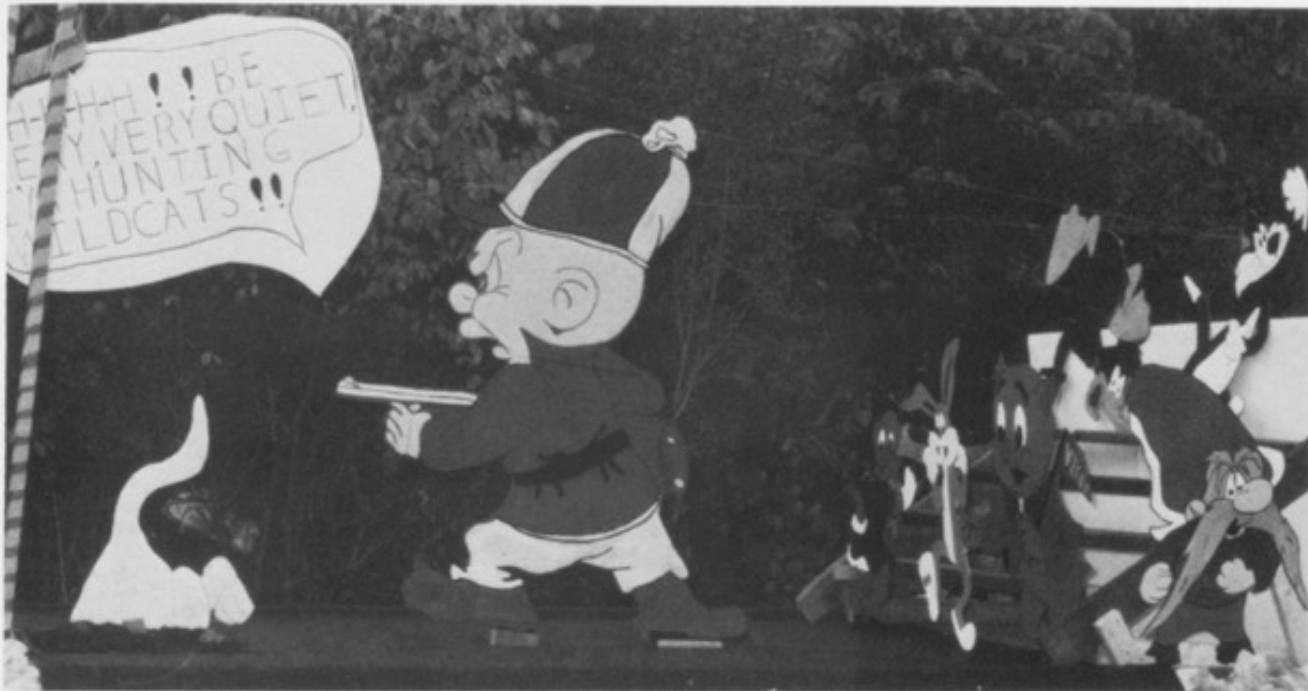
# HOMECOMING "75"

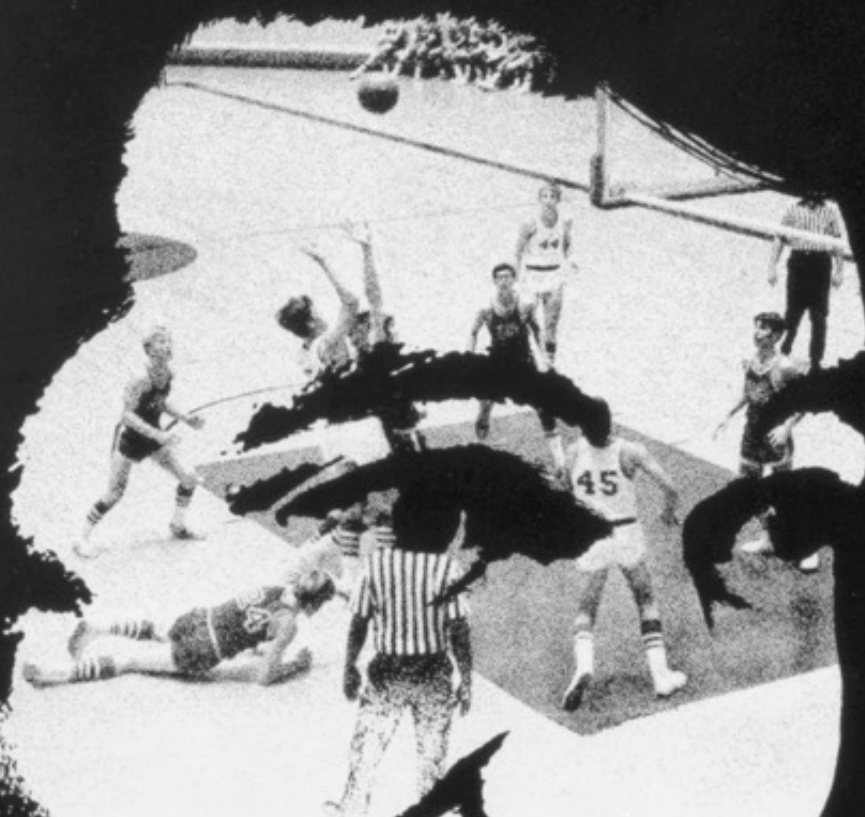
A wide variety of talent was shown in skits, songs, and monologues. Music also highlighted the follies with voice and piano solos and selections by the Acappella Choir.

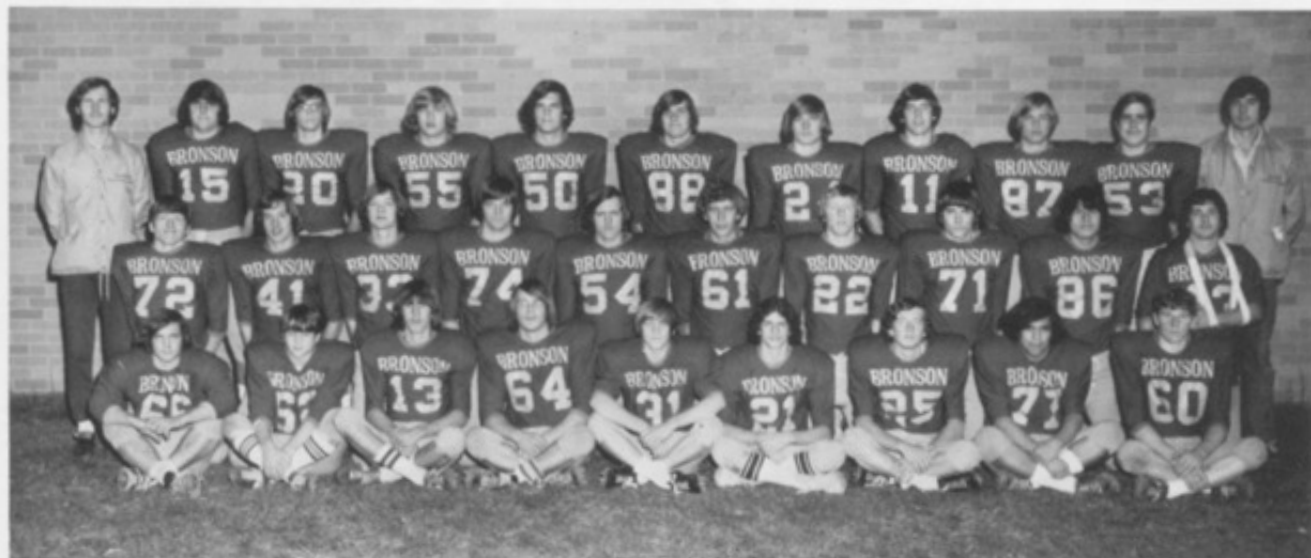
