



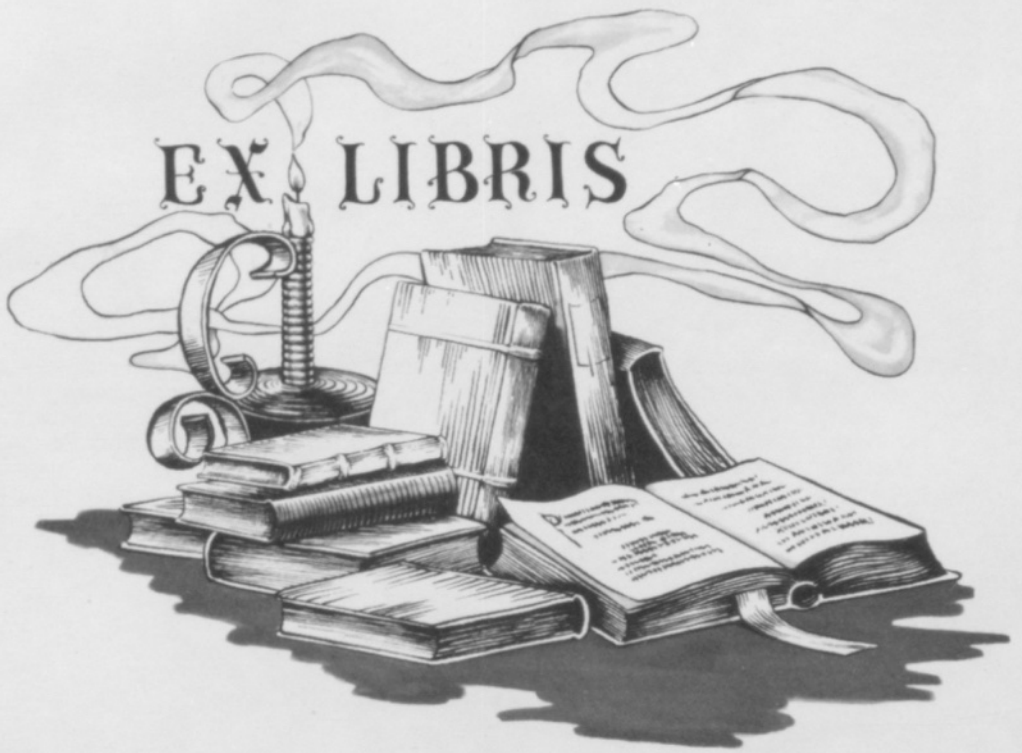

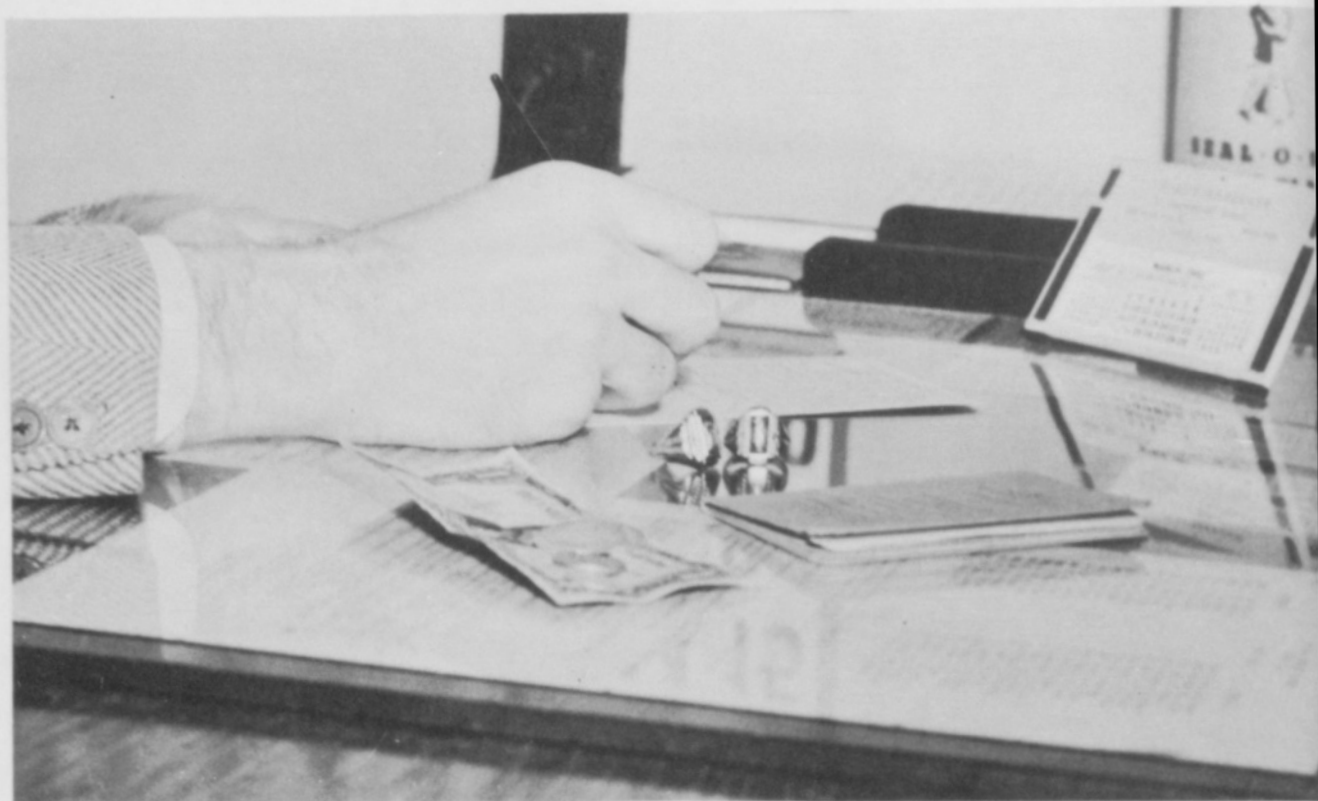

She, with the assistance of a number of high school girls, prepares and serves hot lunches to the students in both the Central and Anderson schools.

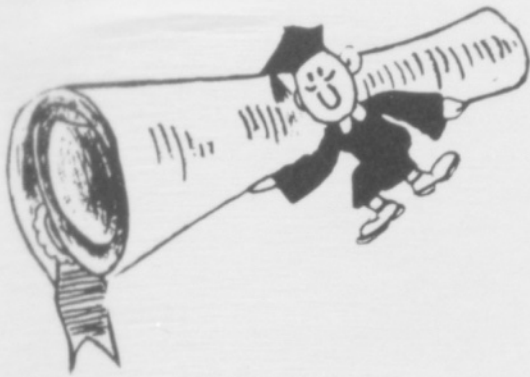

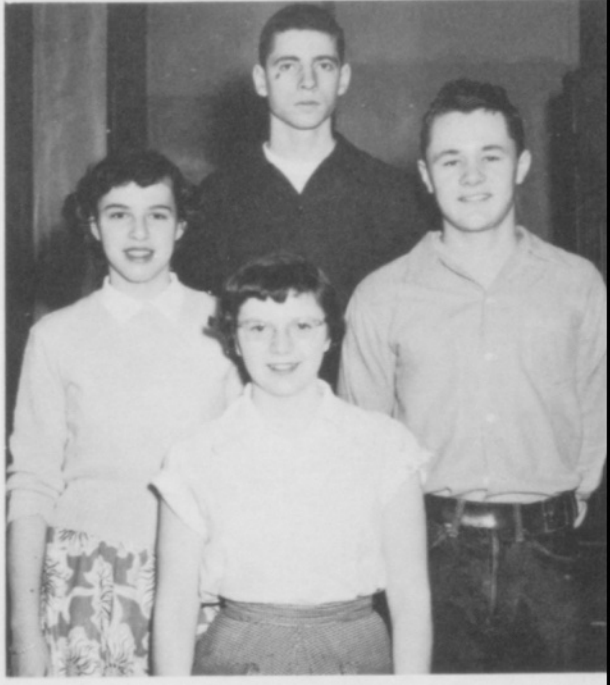
The class of '52 has eighty-eight students this year. As a money-making project the Sophomores have been having sandwich sales and also entered floats in the Halloween and Christmas parades.
