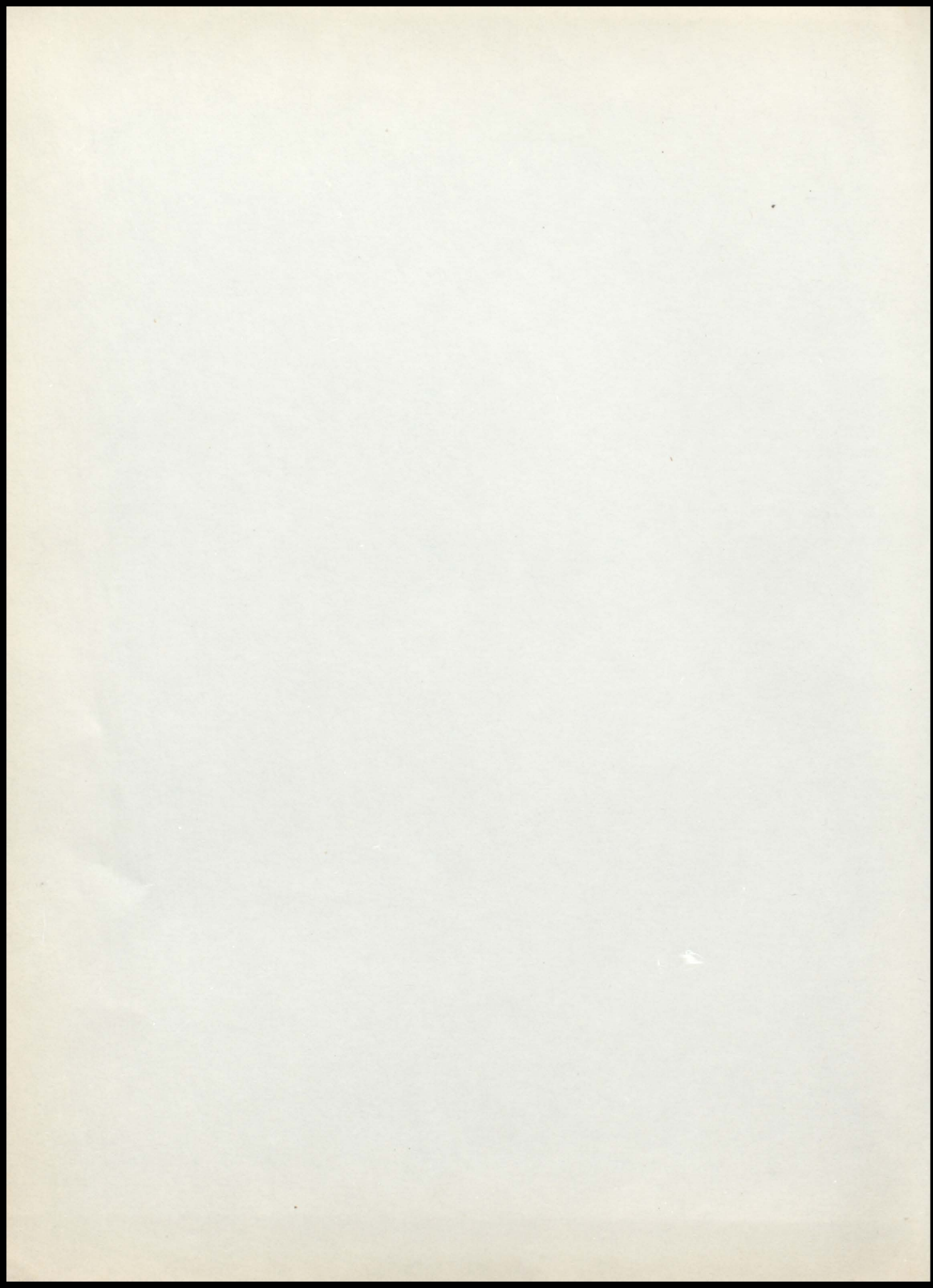

All of the officers have been active members of the class taking part in all the many class functions and should prove to be an able and cooperative team in leading the all-important last year activities of the Class of '53.

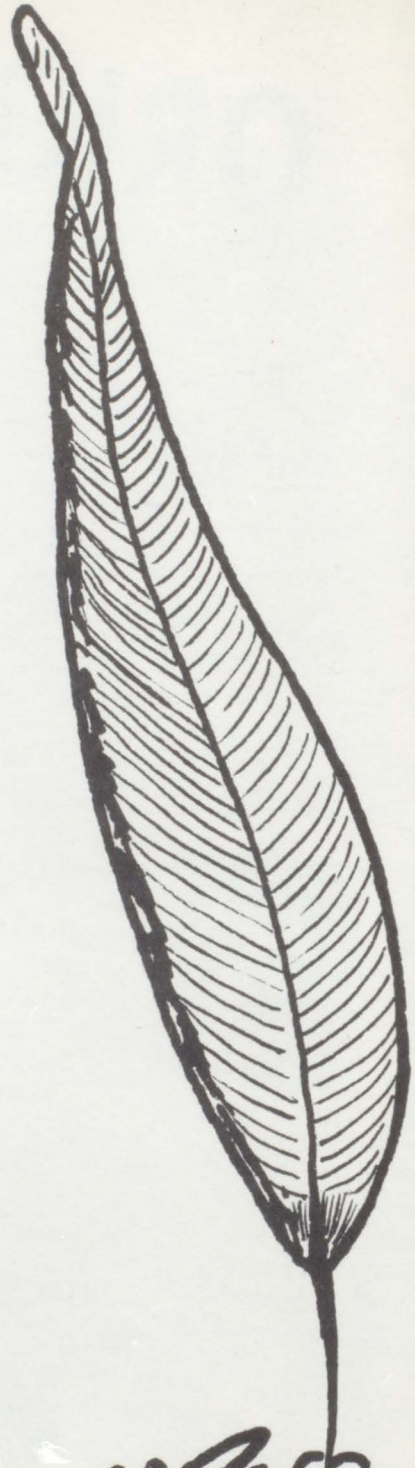

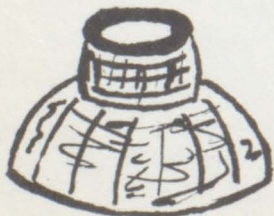

New officers for the coming year will be installed at the Wednesday meeting of the Quincy Community Schools Parent-Teacher Association held at the Civic Center.



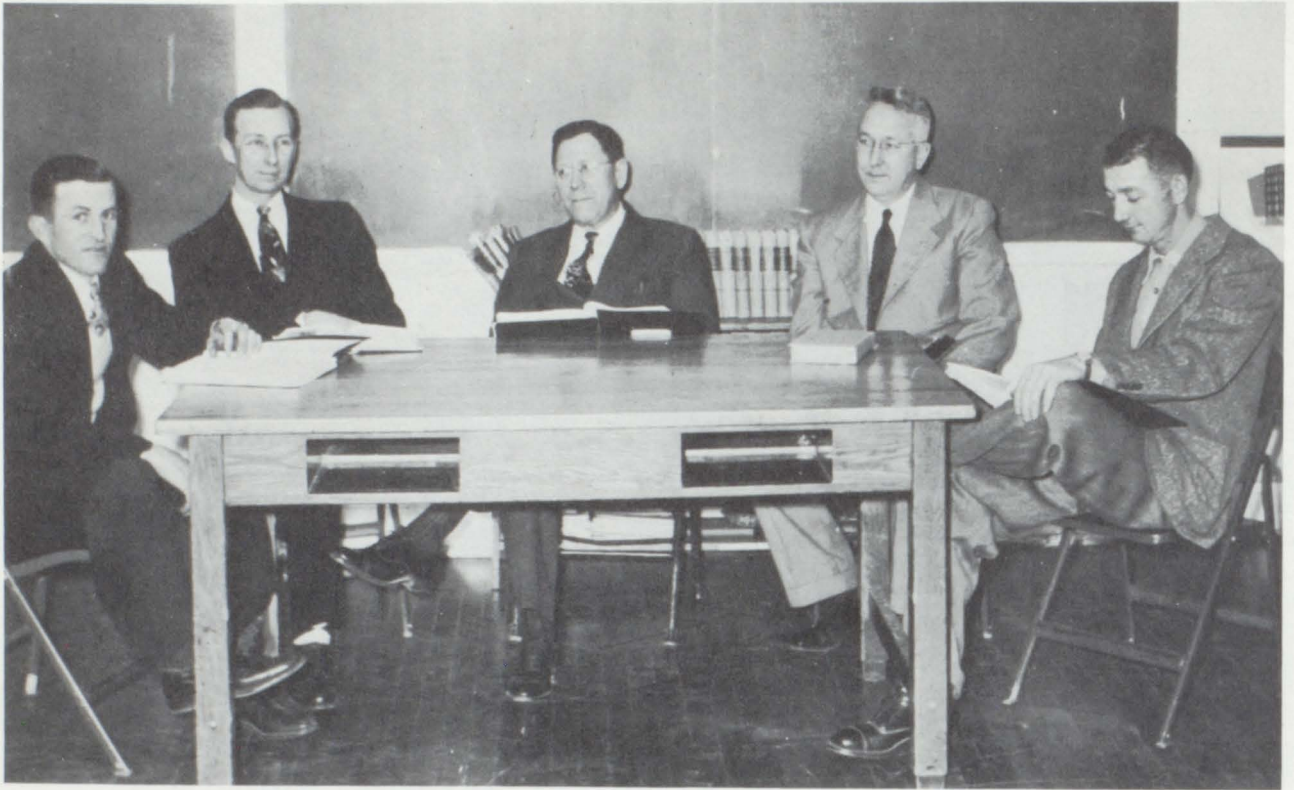
Calvin Enders Earns Master's Degree
