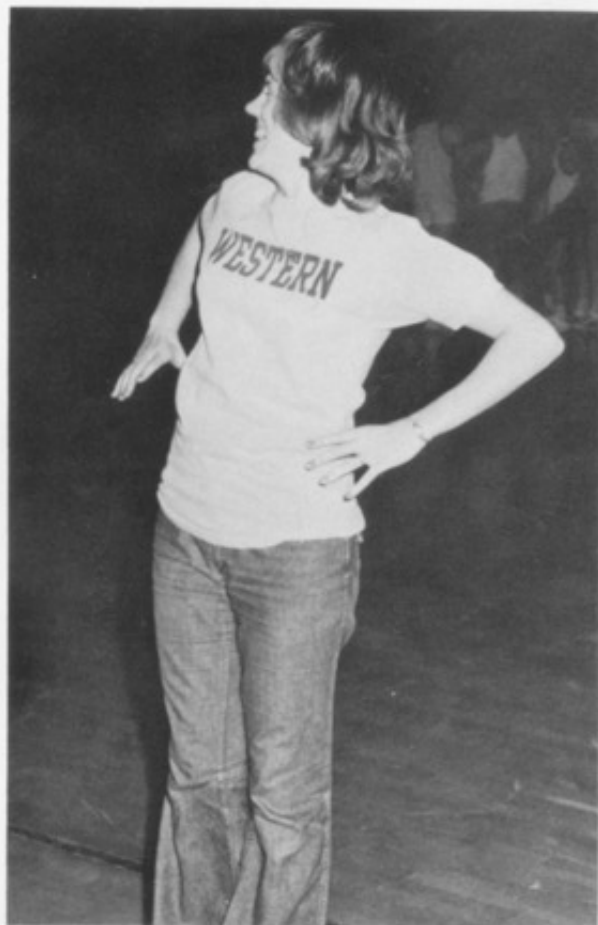

MARLENE BURKHARDT is Mr. Norton's financial secretary. She keeps track of all the money for various clubs and activities.





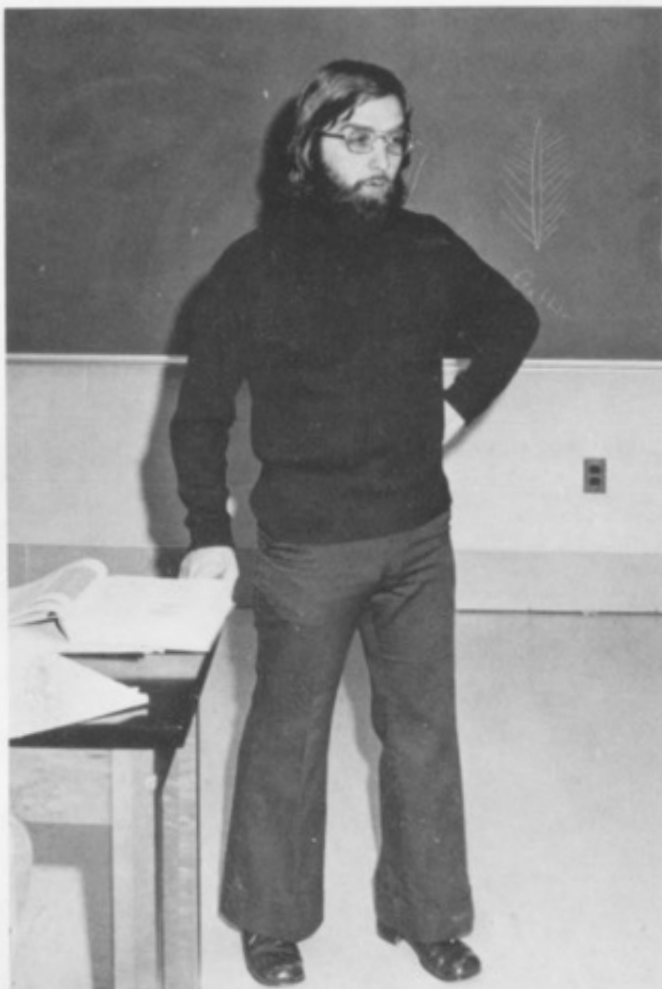

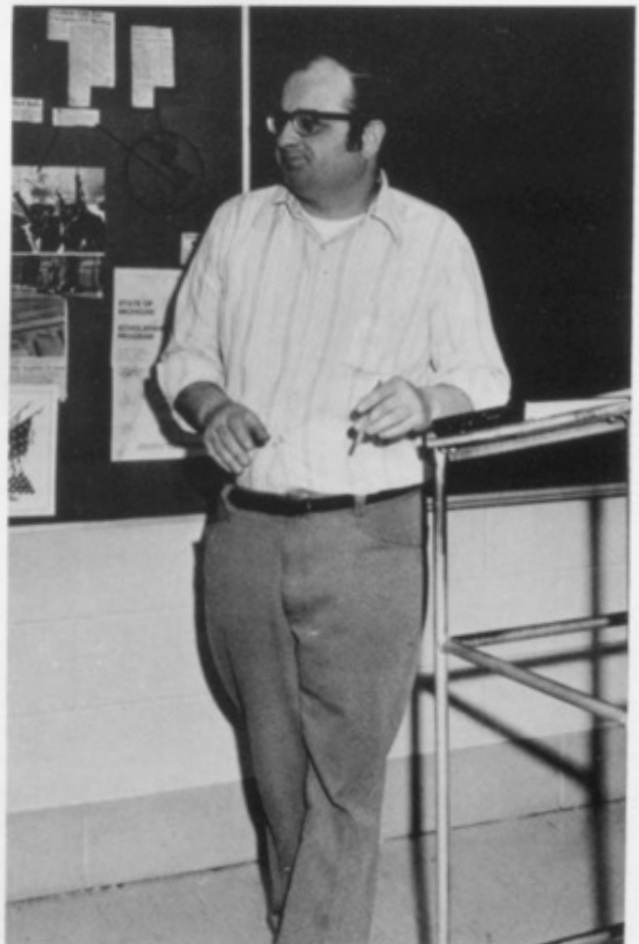
MRS. ELLEN SHOUN

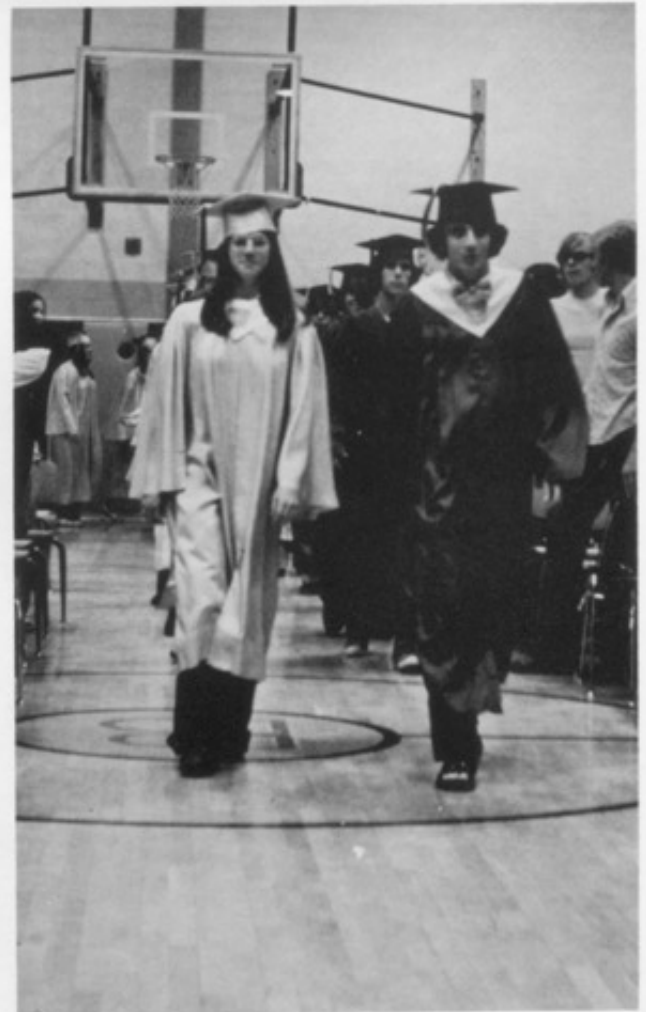


# *Graduation '74*
