

MARLENE BURKHARDT is Mr. Norton's financial secretary. She keeps track of all the money for various clubs and activities.






As tradition through the years, the class of '74 was escorted to the final stage of Graduation by the honor guards of the class of '75.




























Somewhere Over the Rainbow
