Thespians Go Big

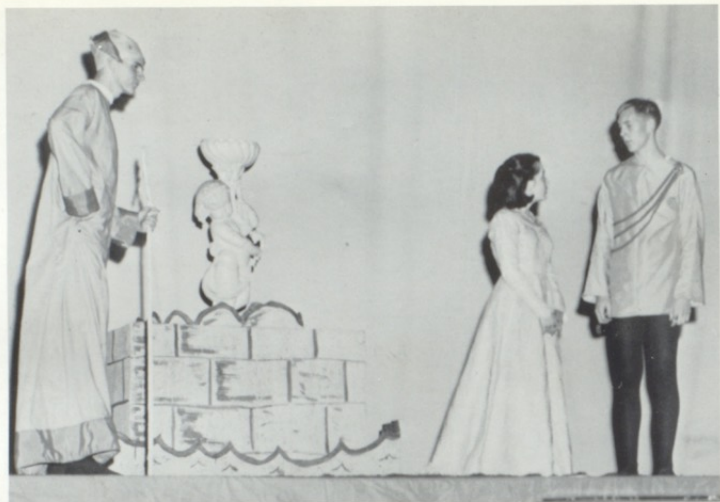

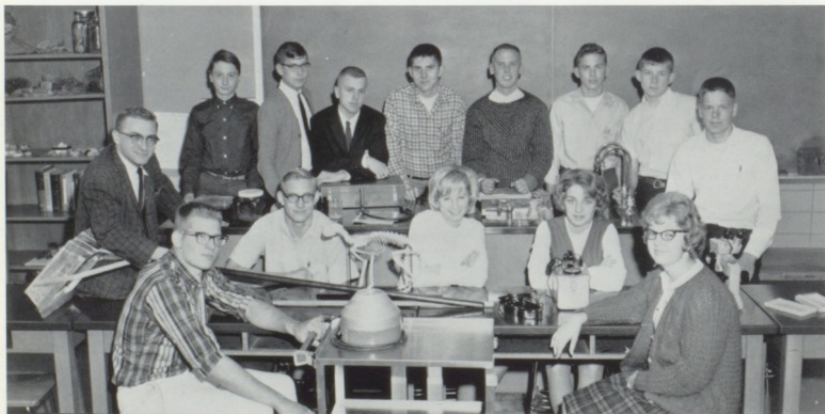

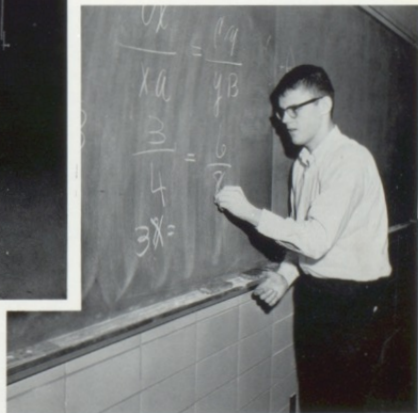

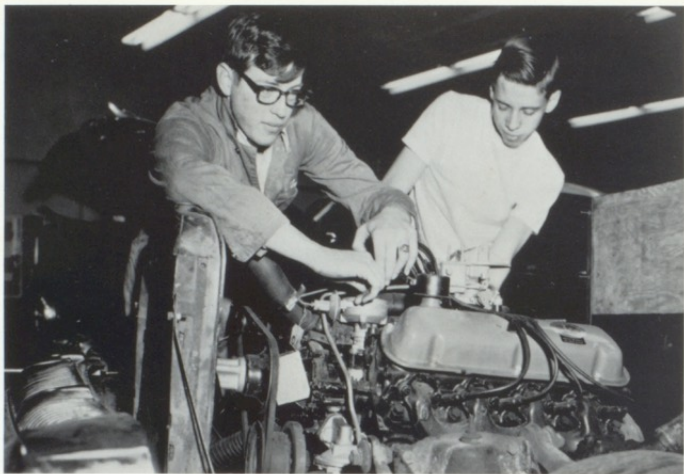
Future Nurses Work as Aids

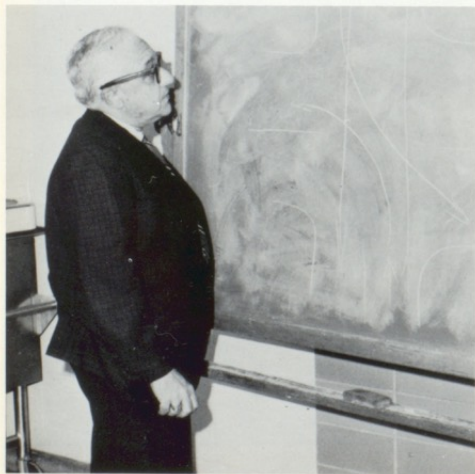

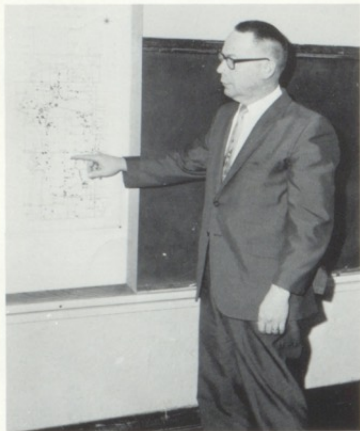
