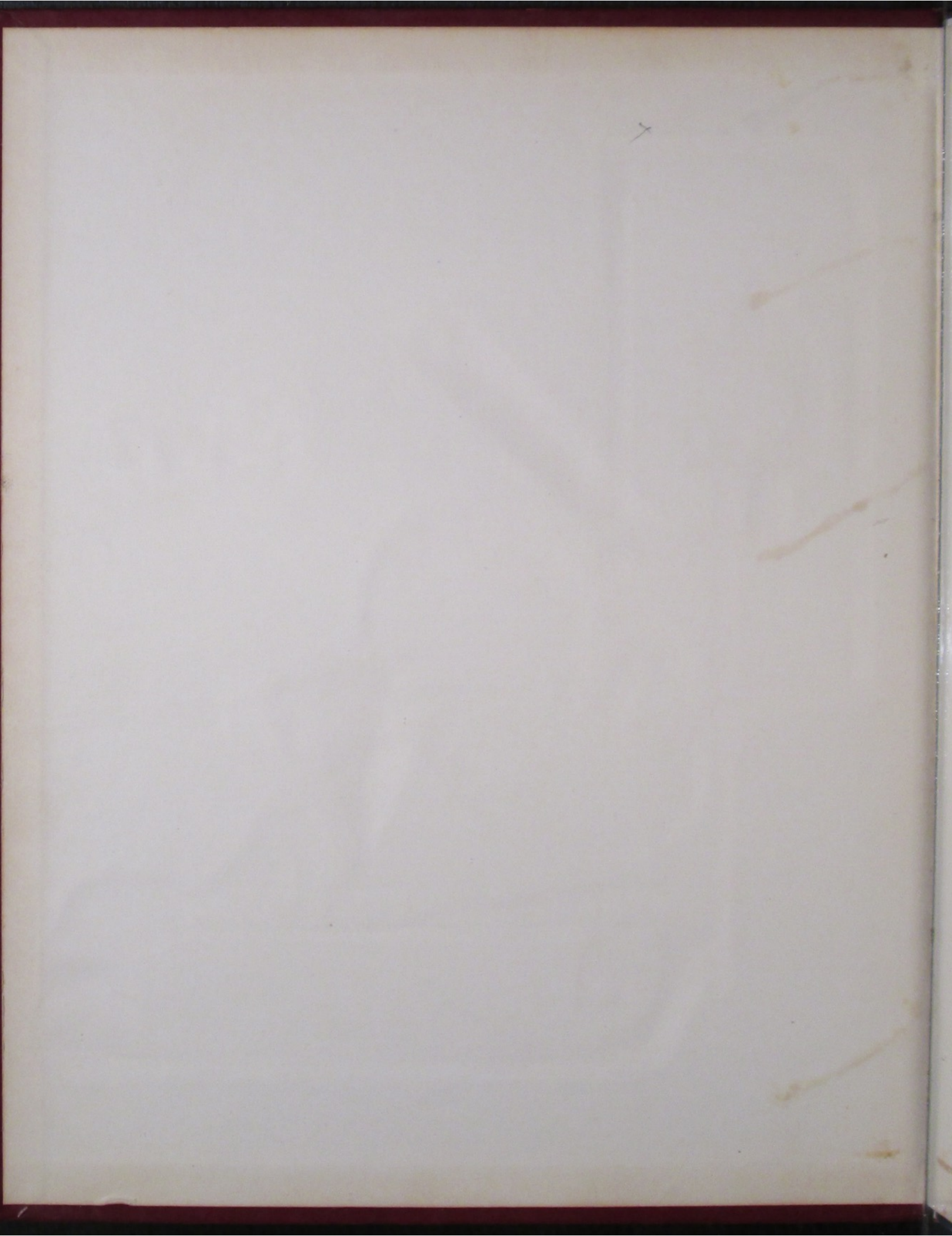

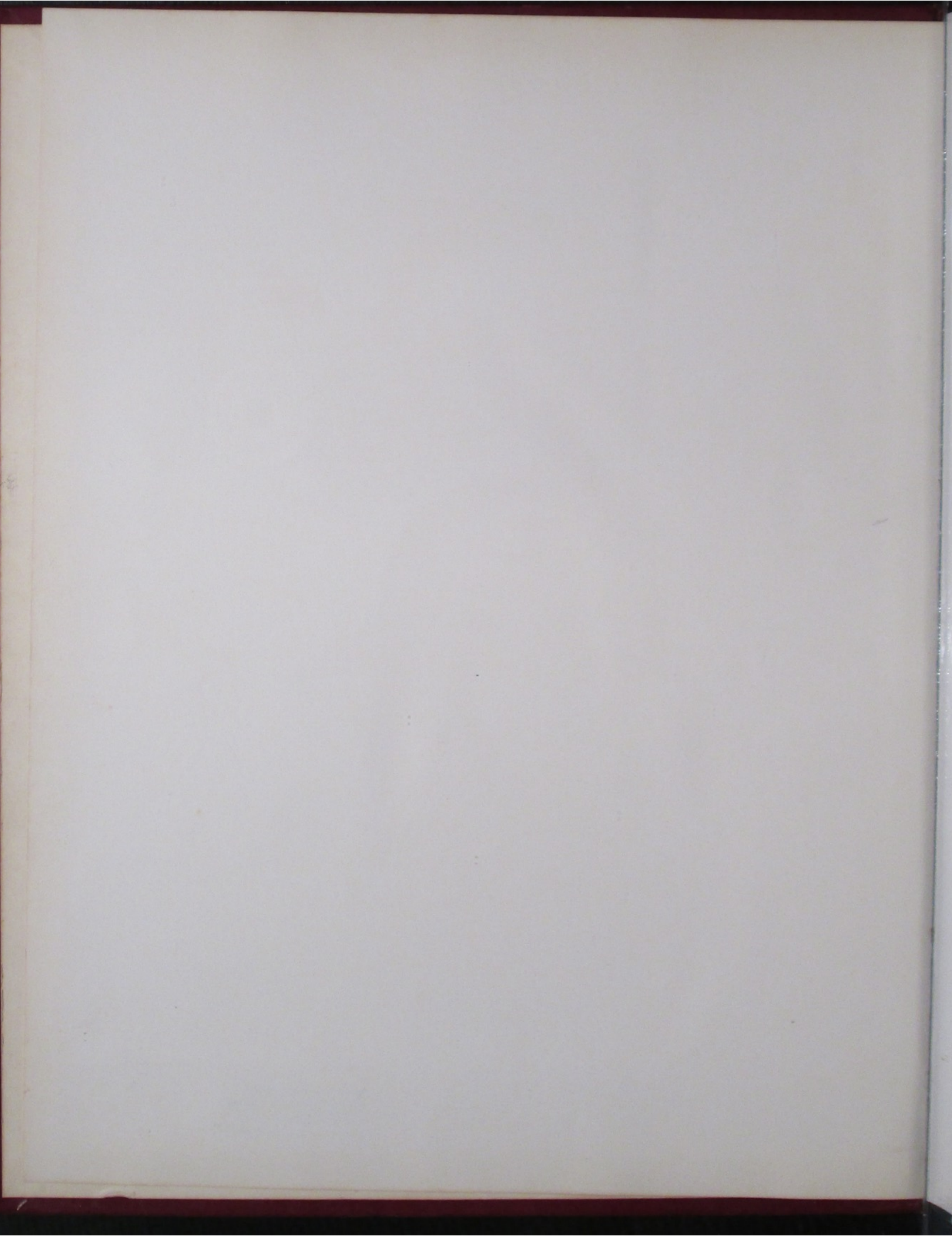

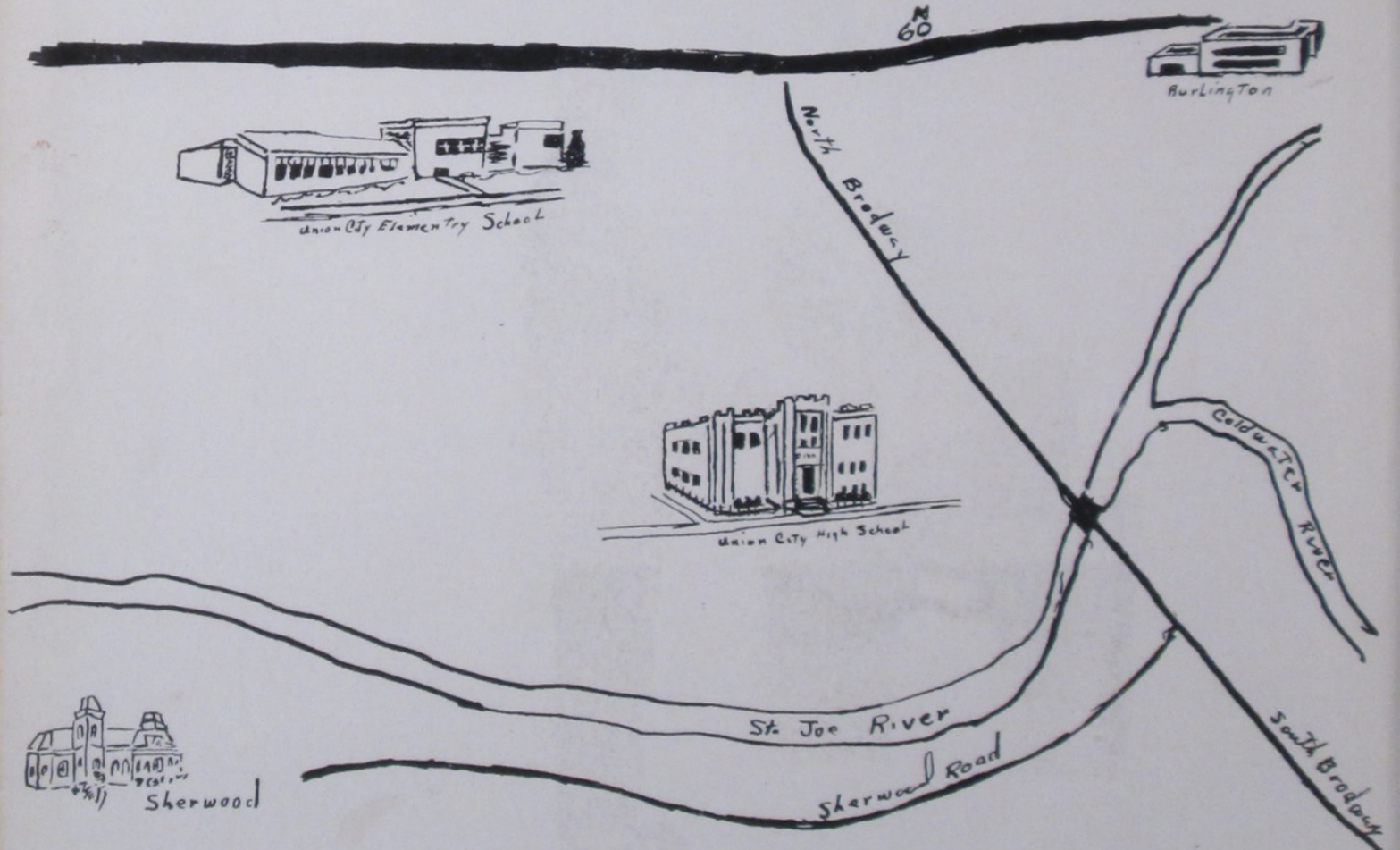


DORETHA JUNE HAGELSHAW

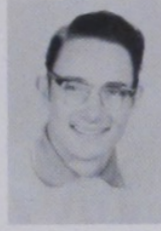

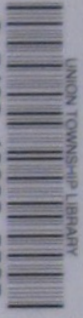
