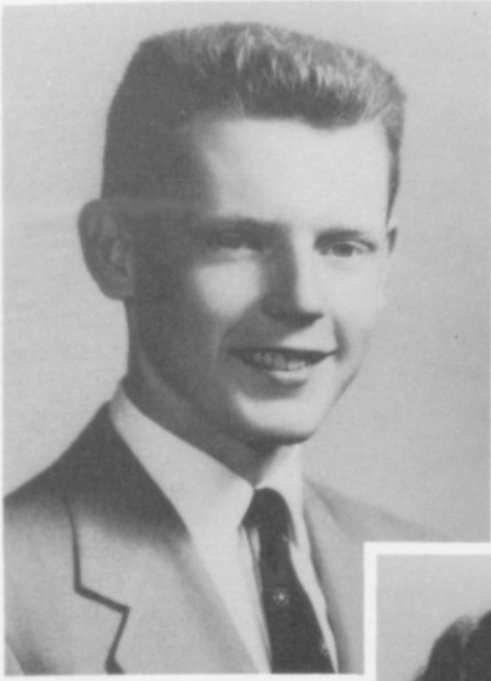
SOPHOMORES ! ! - - - romance - - - going steady - - - serving at the Prom - - - living for Friday nights - - - ordering class rings.

During the past several years, the bus drivers have made an excellent safety record. We are very proud of our drivers and good busses.

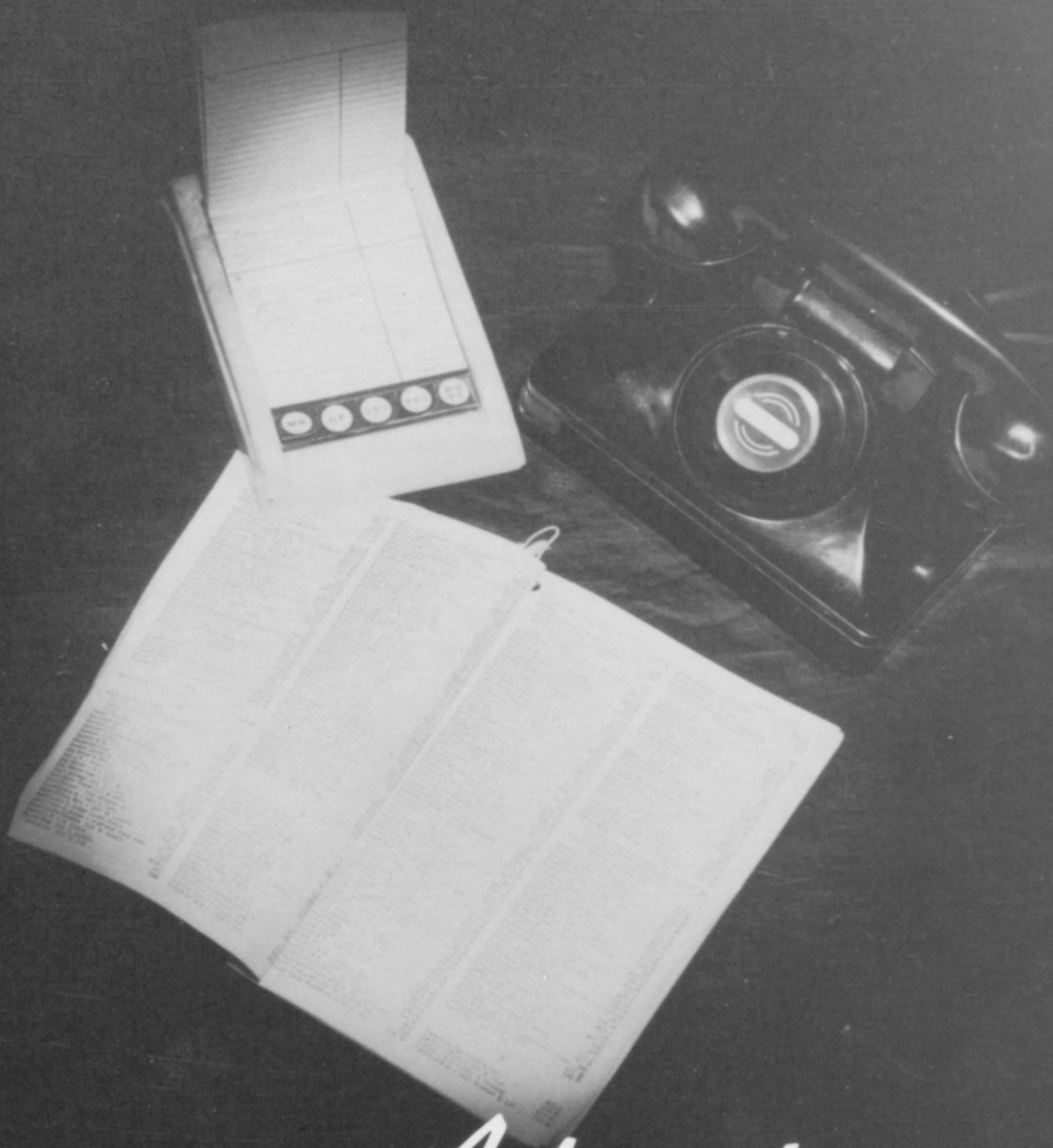
