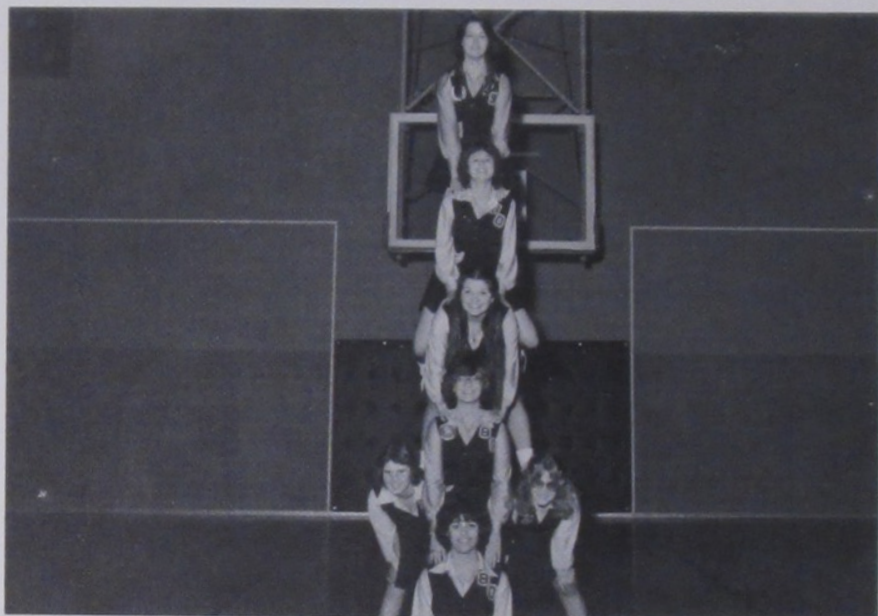

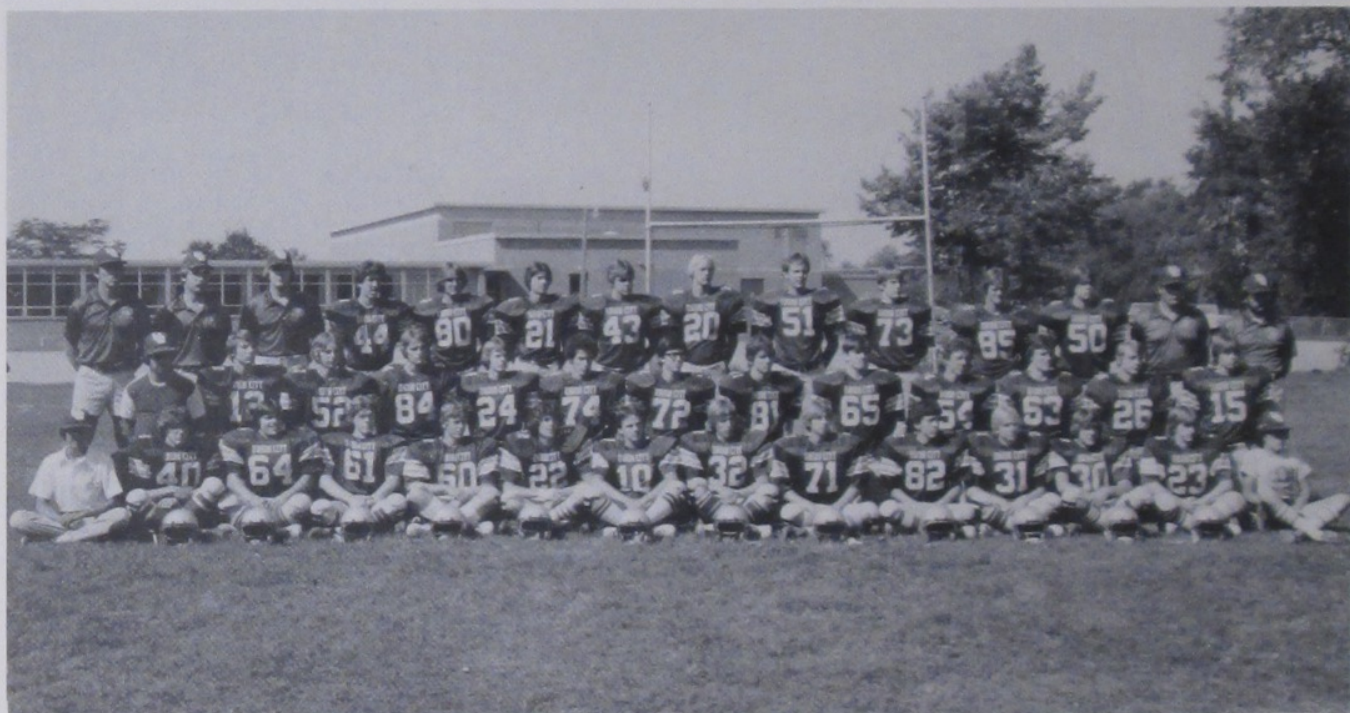

The 1978 Charger football team brought winning back to Union City. They started the 1978 season out on the left foot by losing to Lansing Cath. Cent. But then the Chargers regained a firm footing and won the next six games. They finished 6 and 1 in the Big 8 Conference with an overall record of 8 and 2 for the season.

A big loss shocked the Charger offense when one of their players was injured. Brian AcMoody started last year and he began this year as a starter until a broken ankle stopped his quarterbacking.

Then sophomore Eric Palmatier moved to the Charger's quarterback spot. He had a big shoe to fill but did the job extremely well and impressed the team as well as the coaching staff. Eric's first game was against Springport. The Chargers won very impressively 41-0. Over all the varsity team did well placing fourth in conference.



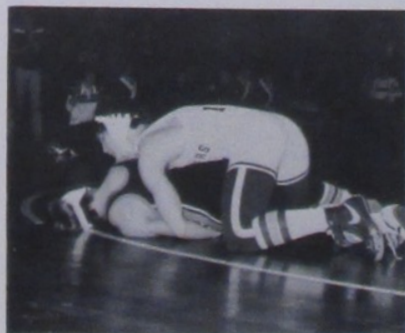

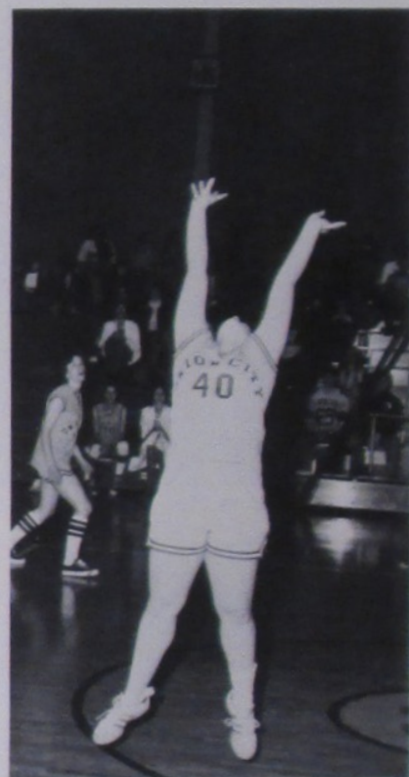

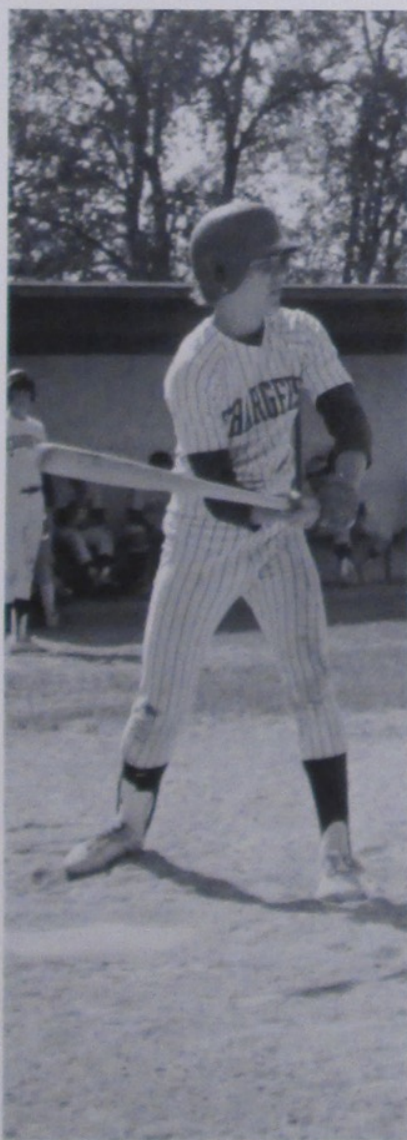

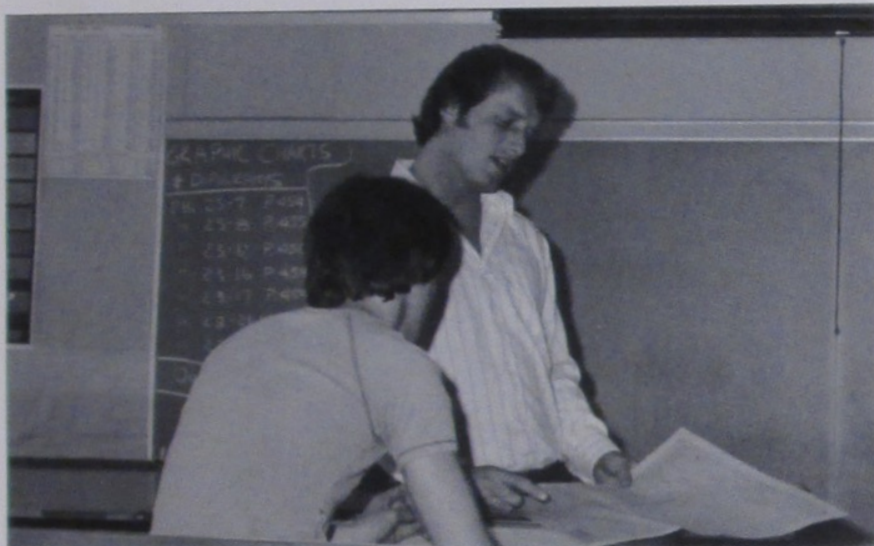

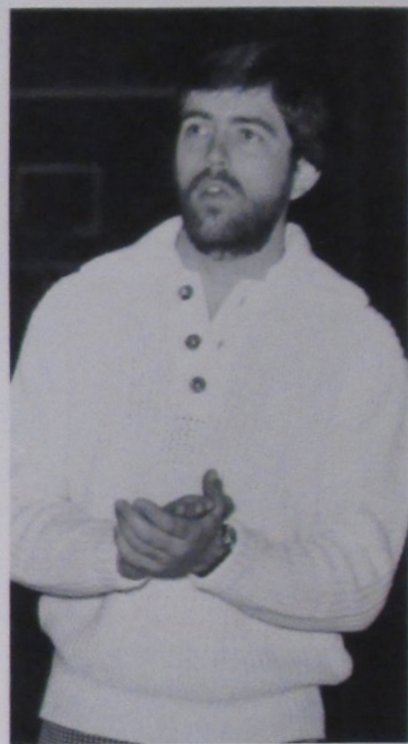

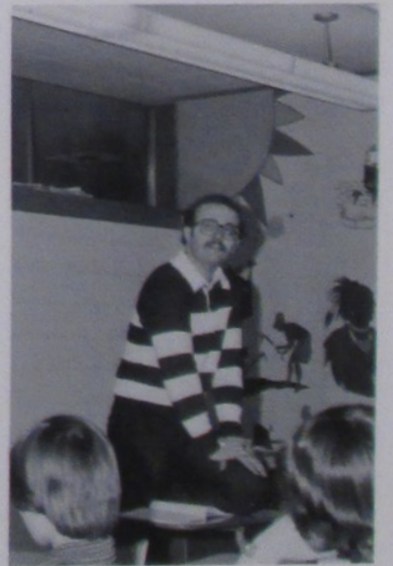

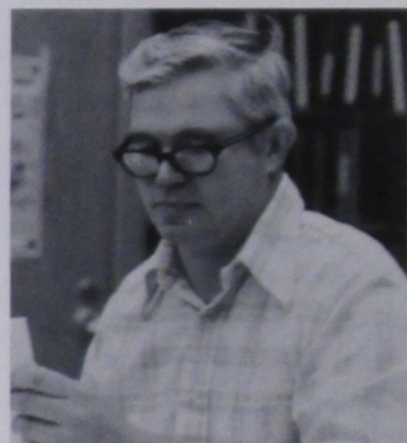

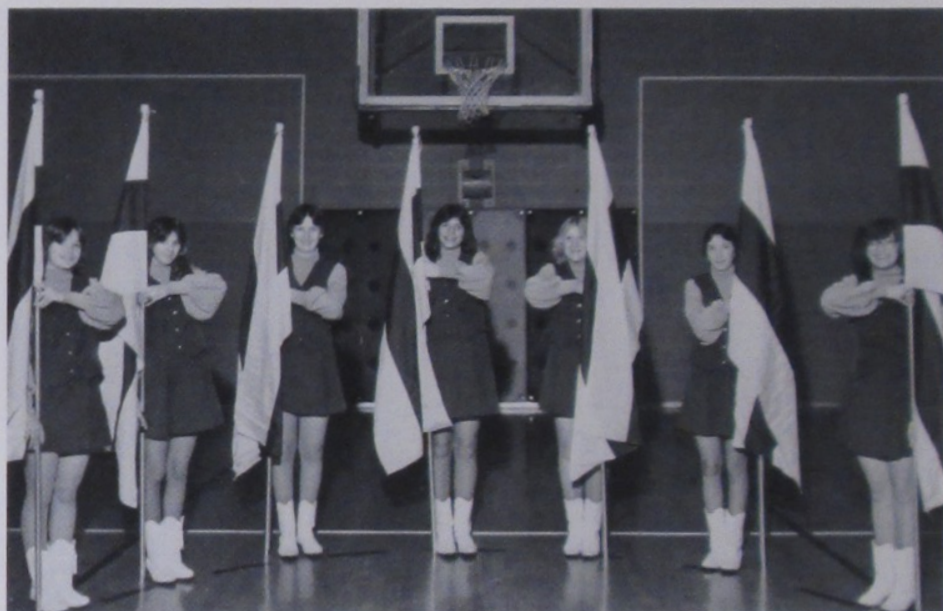
