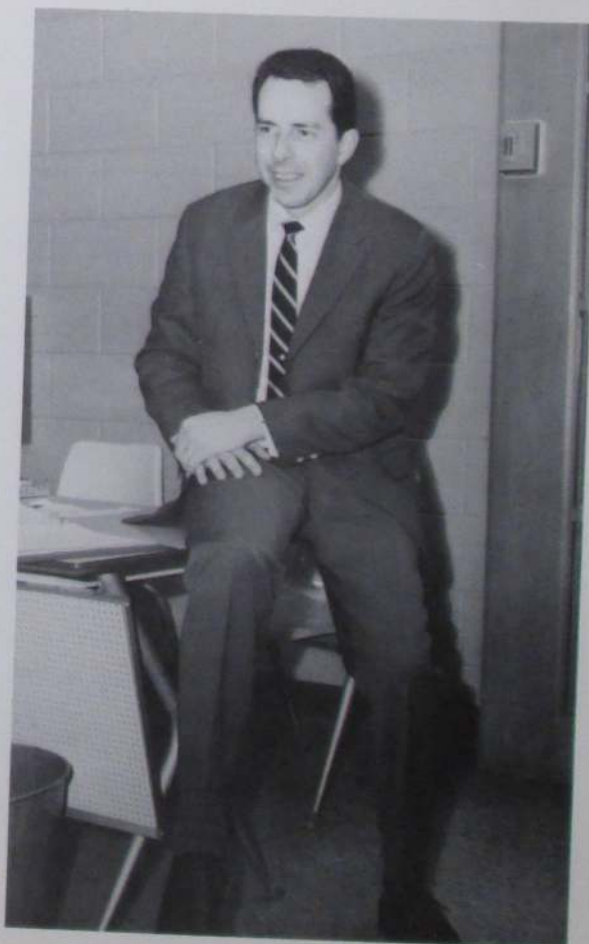

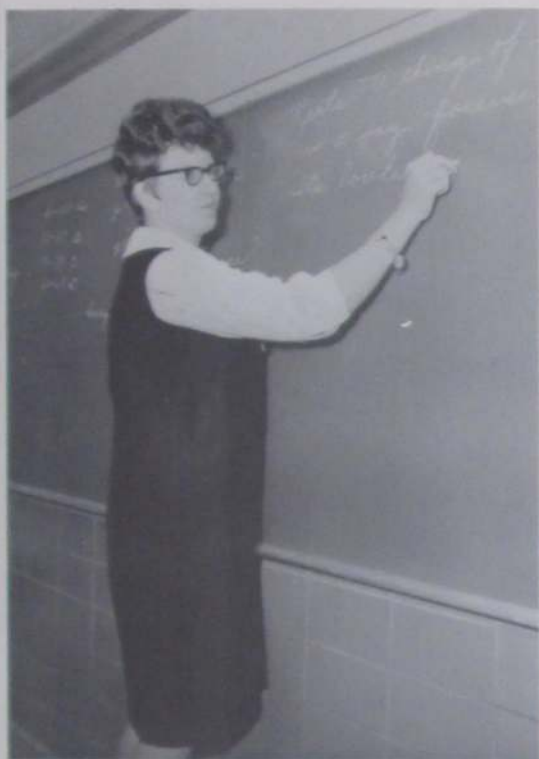

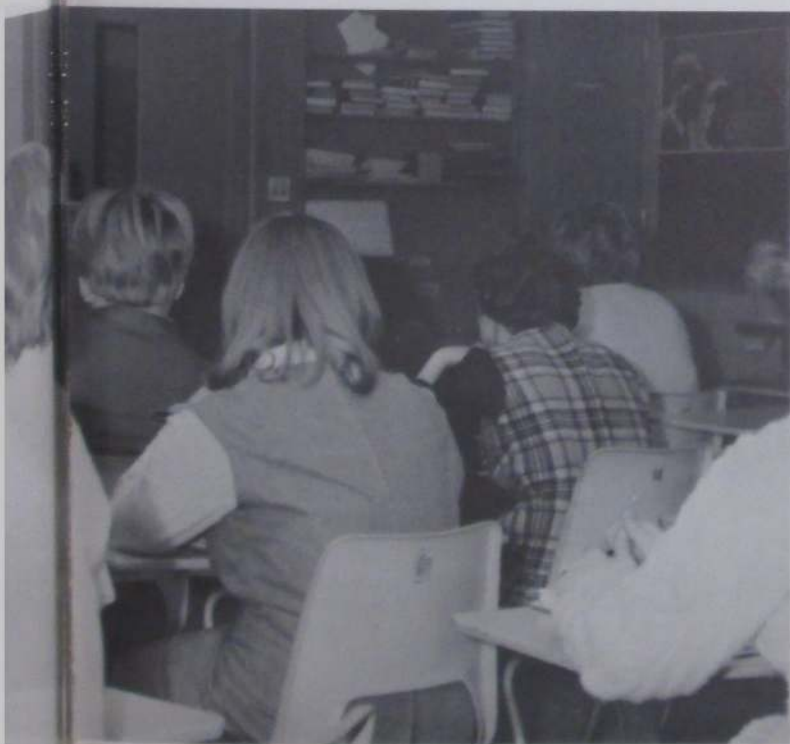

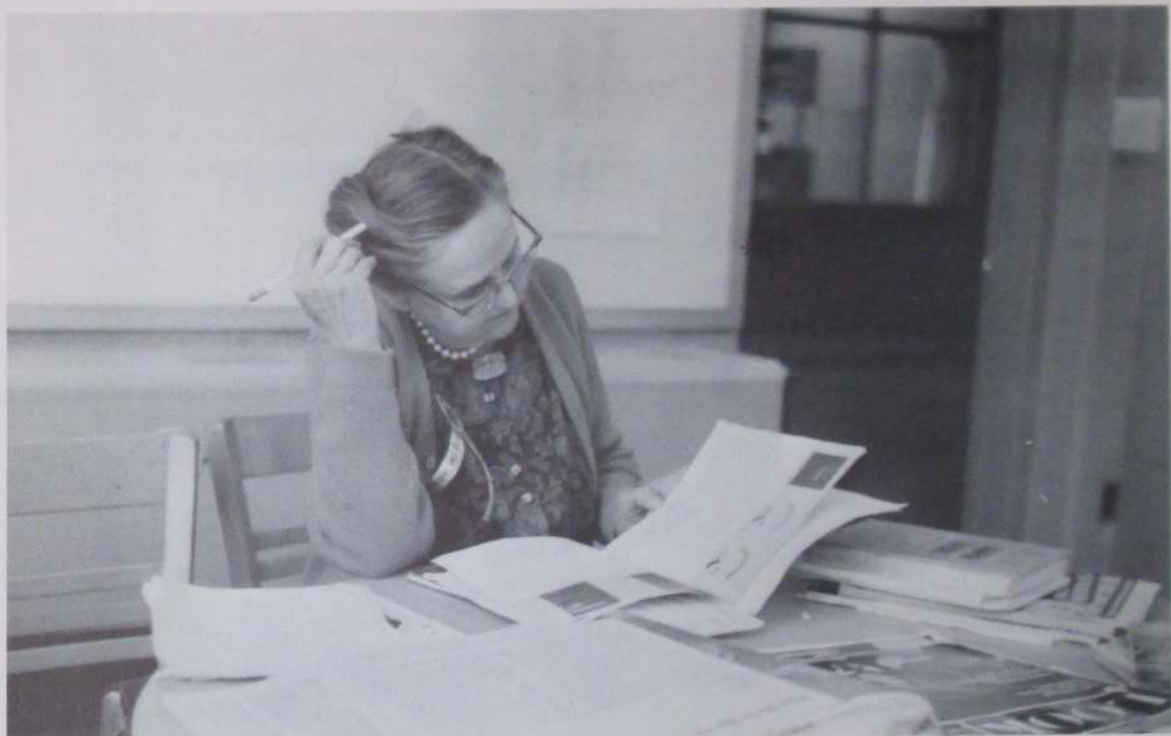

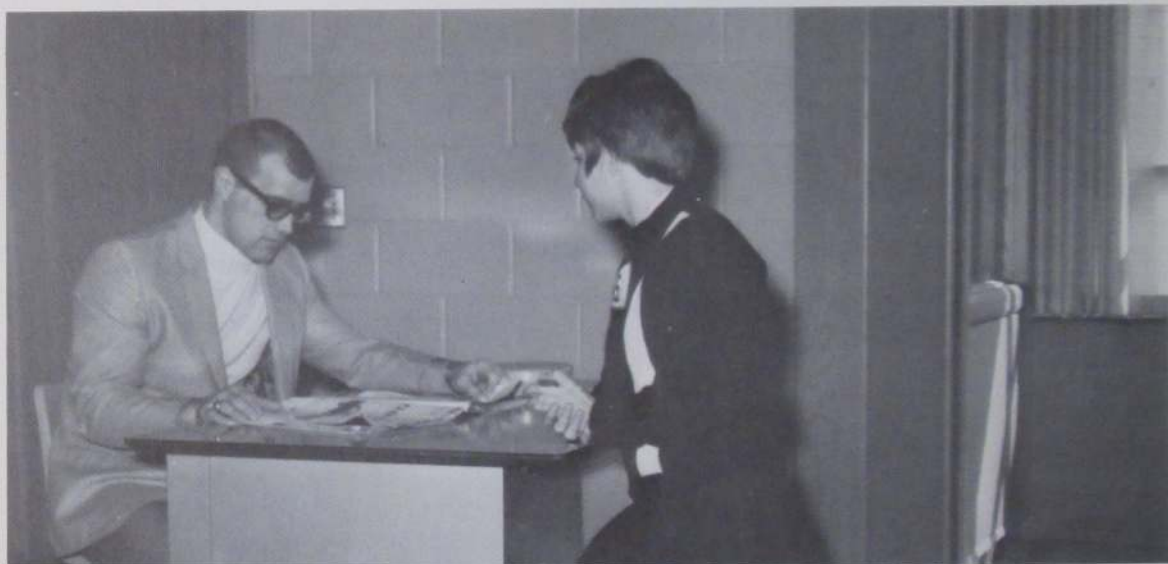

Homecoming week 1968 was a splendid example of the most memorable tradition Union City has known.

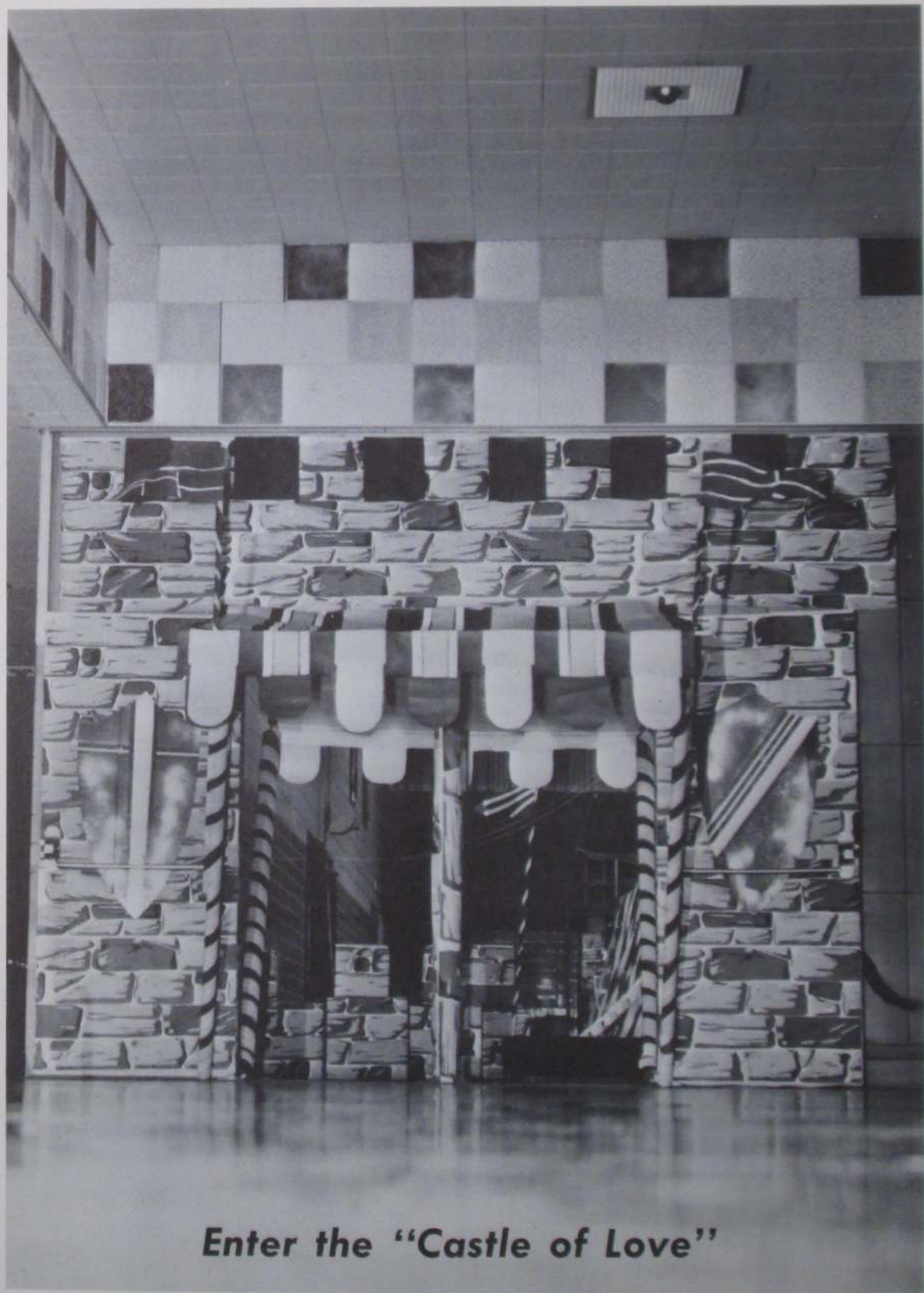

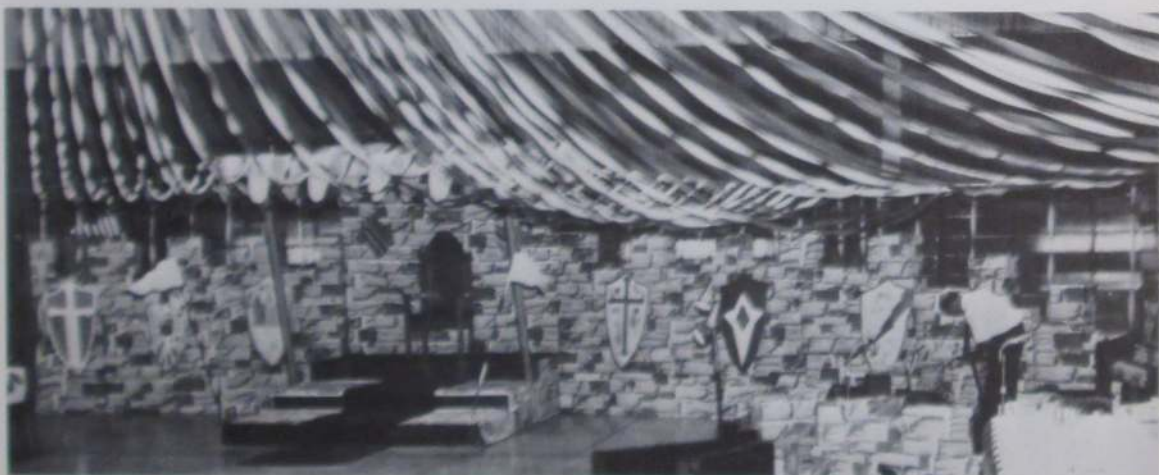

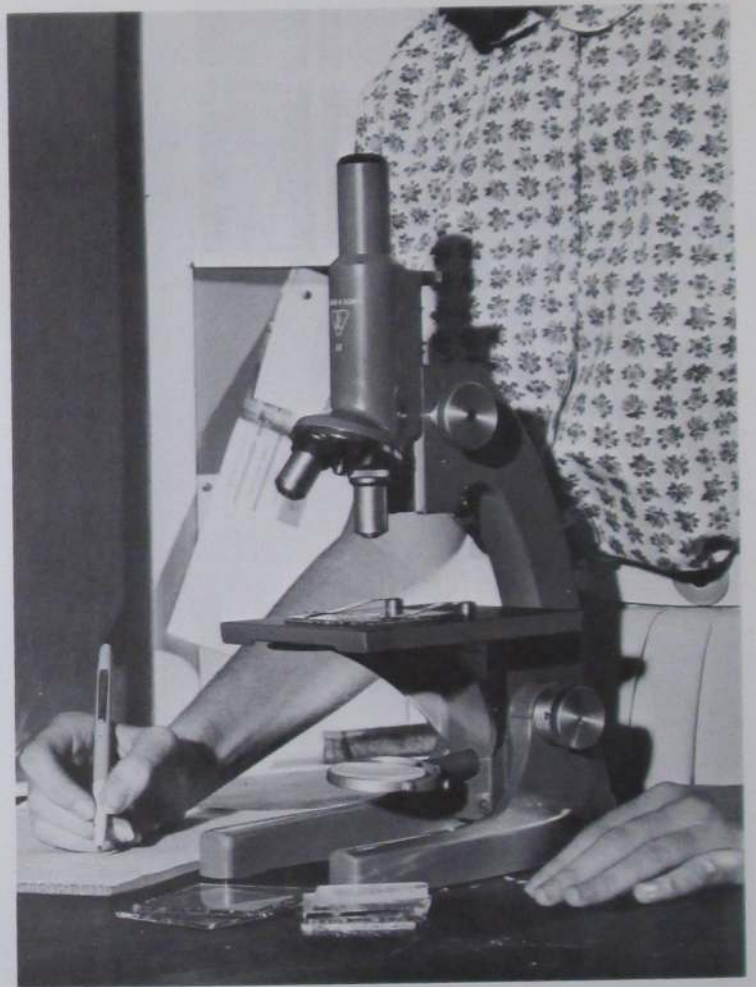


Enter the "Castle of Love"

The outstanding quality this year's team acquired was a "never quit" attitude that will always make future winners.





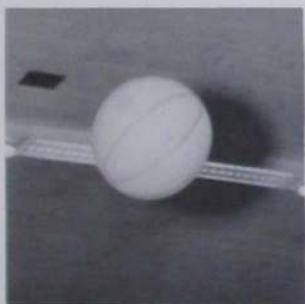

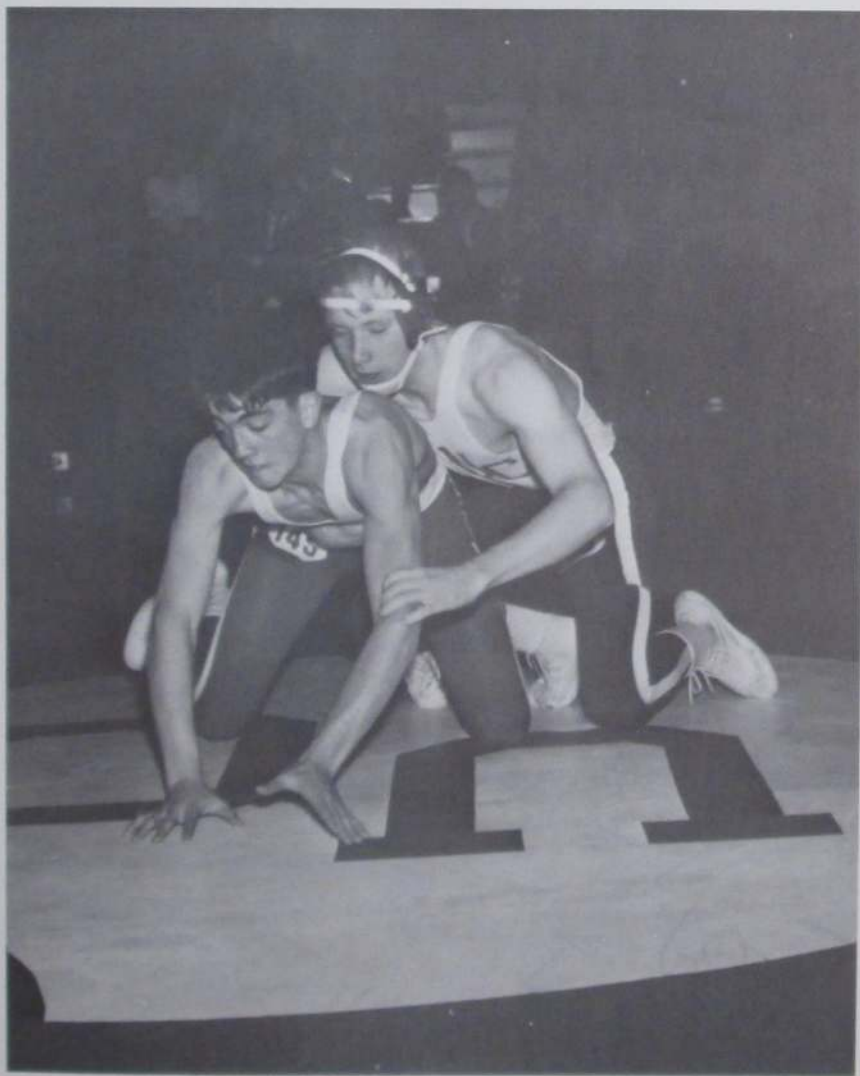

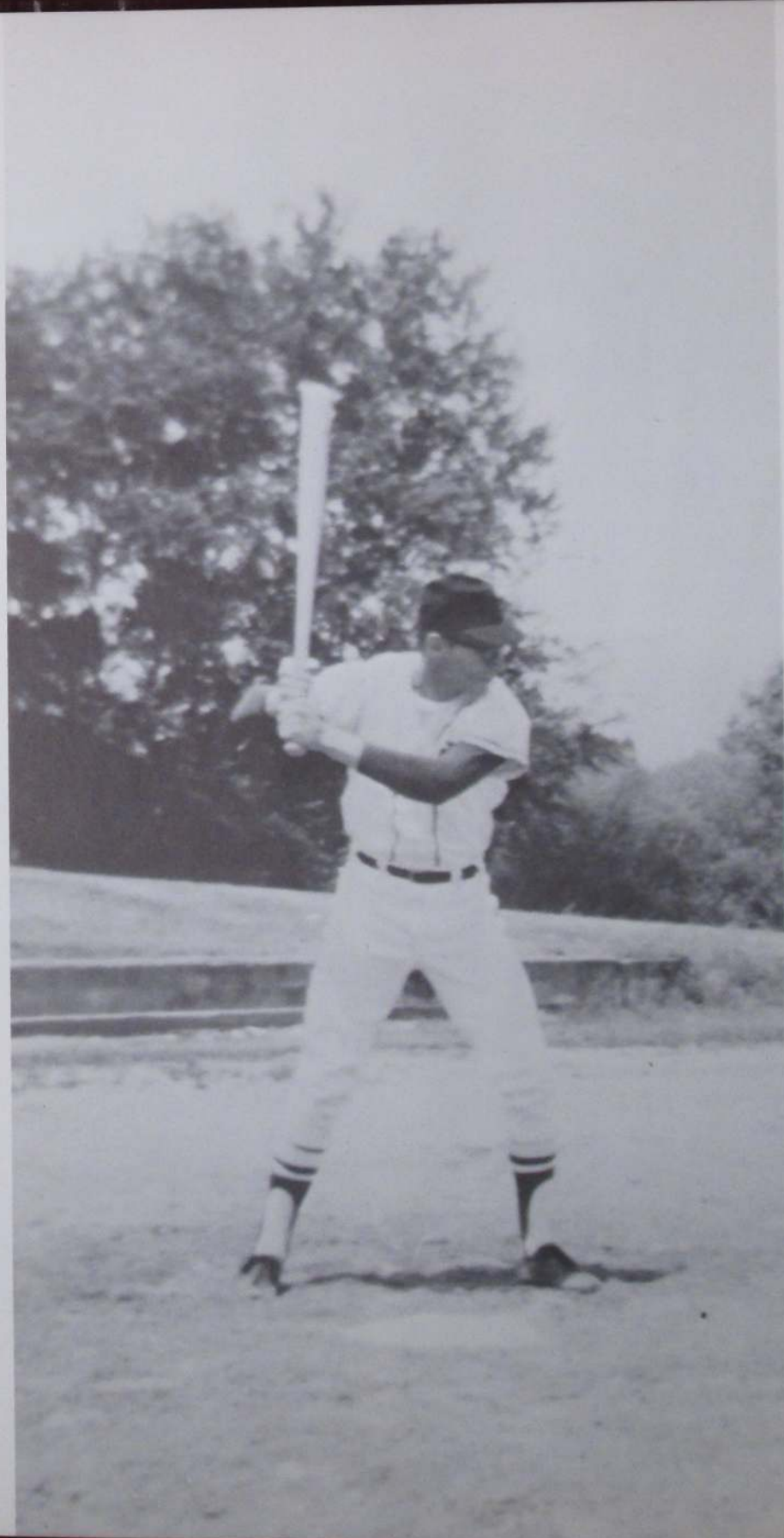

The 1969 Maroon varsity baseball team compiled a highly successful 9-5 record which included a 6-1 conference record giving the Maroons a second place finish in the Little C, highest for any Maroon team in the past several years. The varsity squad was tied for first place going into their last game but fell to a strong Bronson team by a score of 9-2. Highlights of the season included an opening 6-4 win over Jonesville, a 7-4 win over arch-rival Athens, and a hard-fought, extra-inning win over Homer by a score of 4-3.

Following the completion of the regular season, the first annual Union City Invitational Baseball Tournament was held involving five area teams. After an opening 7-6 win over Quincy, the Maroon bats became suddenly silent and games were dropped to Homer by a score of 5-0 and then to Quincy, 5-4. However, the Maroons ended the season on a successful note as they powered their way to a 12-10 win over Colon, blasting four home runs into the river.

Several Union City players received All-Conference recognition at the completion of the league season. Dan Hicks, Wayne Alexander, and Cliff Heisler all were selected for the first team, and Pat Loss was placed on the second team. Steve Patton and Al Pepper received honorable mention. Dan Hicks and Wayne Alexander led the Maroon hitters with league averages of .500 and .407 respectively. They received solid support from Steve Patton, Wendell Wadsworth, Lynn Smith, Cliff Heisler, Al Pepper, and Russ Freds. Pat Loss emerged as the leading pitcher, picking up four wins. Lynn Smith and Al Pepper each earned two victories, and freshman Dan Kever picked up the other win in relief.

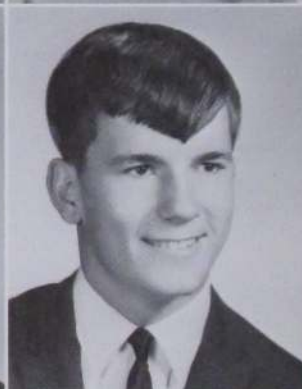

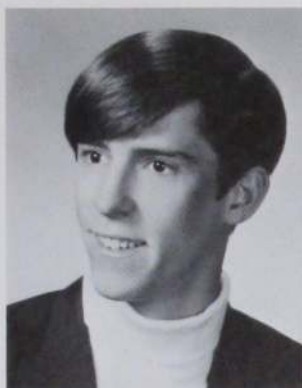

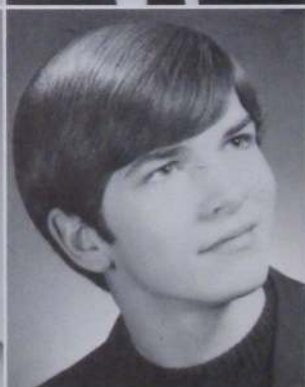
