He supervises the principals, who in turn run the individual. schools.

## Little-C Conference Champs

The result, of course, is the winning touchdown. Coaches Longhini and Chard reflect the joy felt by the team and all the fans present.

Well, Quincy finally did it. Our football team took the first solo conference championship since 1949. In 1959, though, we held a tri-championship with two other Little C teams. In winning this year we set and broke many records. We put 6 men on the All Conference squad; (Jerry Salyer, Mike Moore, Claude Nance, Ken King, Bill McConnell, and Chuck Ames; Honorable Mention were Bill Bradley, Larry Reichhart, Jim Hutchinś, Dan Wilkinson, and Chuck Cook). We also put 2 men on an All-State team: (Mike Moore and Jerry Salyer on 2nd team U.P.I. and Jerry on 2nd team A.P.; Honorable Mention include Mike Moore, Chuck Ames, and Larry Reichhart-A.P.) We went through our first undefeated season since 1949 with a tie as our only blemish; the team also ended up 10 th in the state on A.P. and 12 th on U.P.I. polls.

The most unusual picture of year: Jerry Salyer, 48 , walks away from the play. Larry Reichhart, 42 , cuts inside as Chesty Black$\operatorname{man}, 10$, gets his head stepped on by a Homer Trojan who also deals a knee to the thigh of Bud Strauss, 32, who counters with an elbow. Chuck Ames, 74 , would have been hit by 33 of Homer except for Bill McConnell's well-placed toe.
