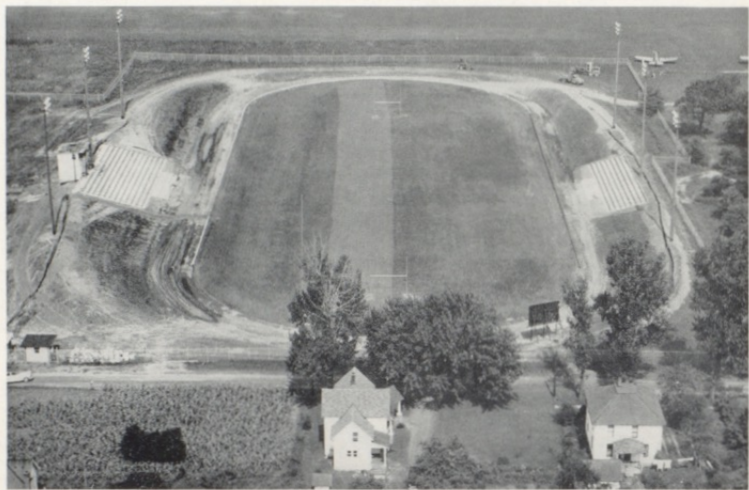

Dec. 15. After being defeated by East Lansing the previous week, the Cards, mad with revenge, thrashed the Albion Wildcats by a 46-24 margin.

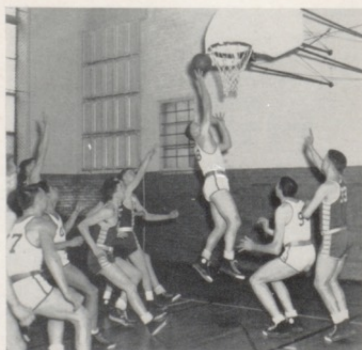

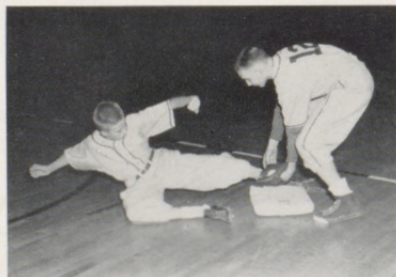

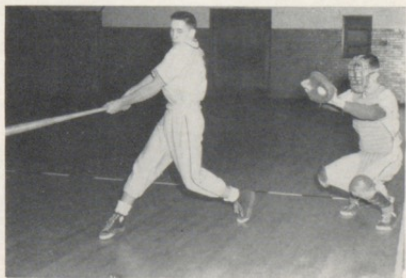
