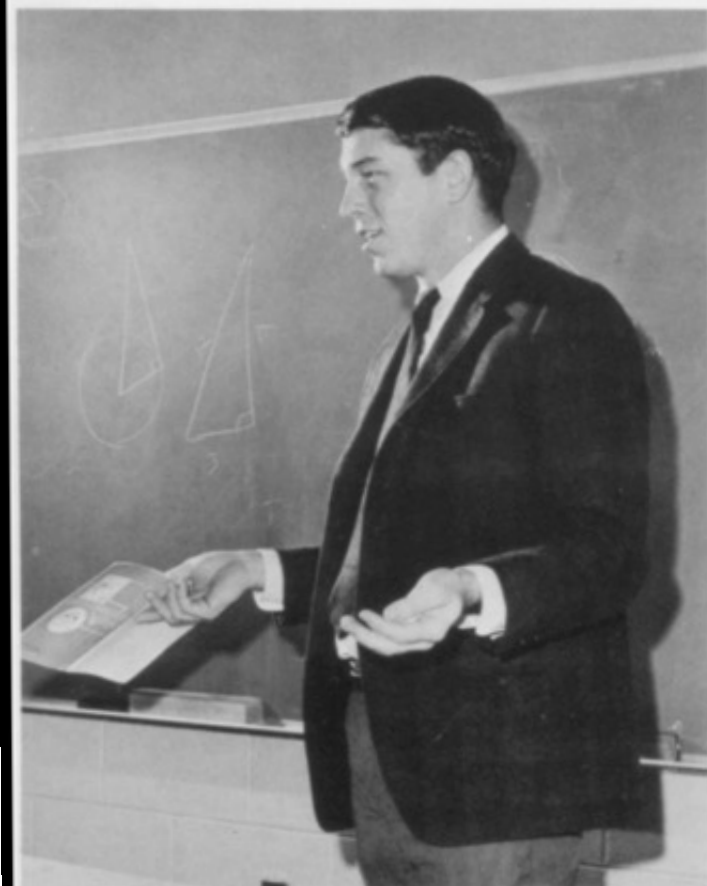
MR. WILLIAM ZABONICK

MRS. NOVA E. RAY

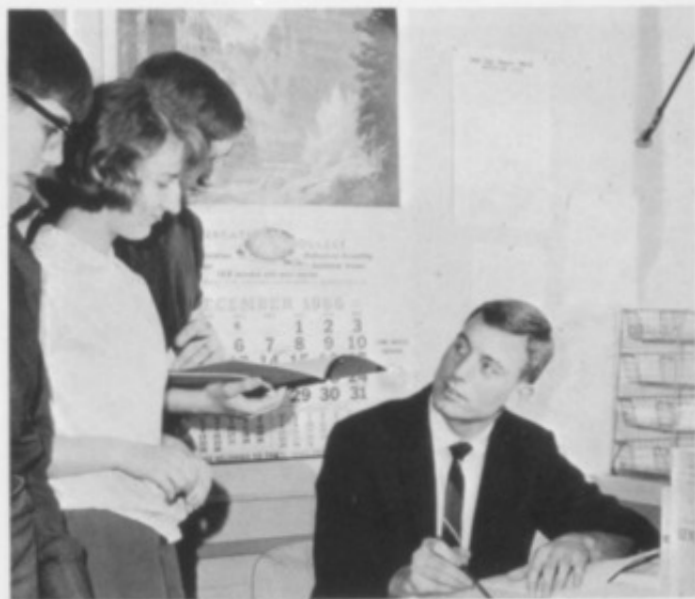
She has her B.S. from Western Michigan University.

He has his B.S. from Michigan State University.

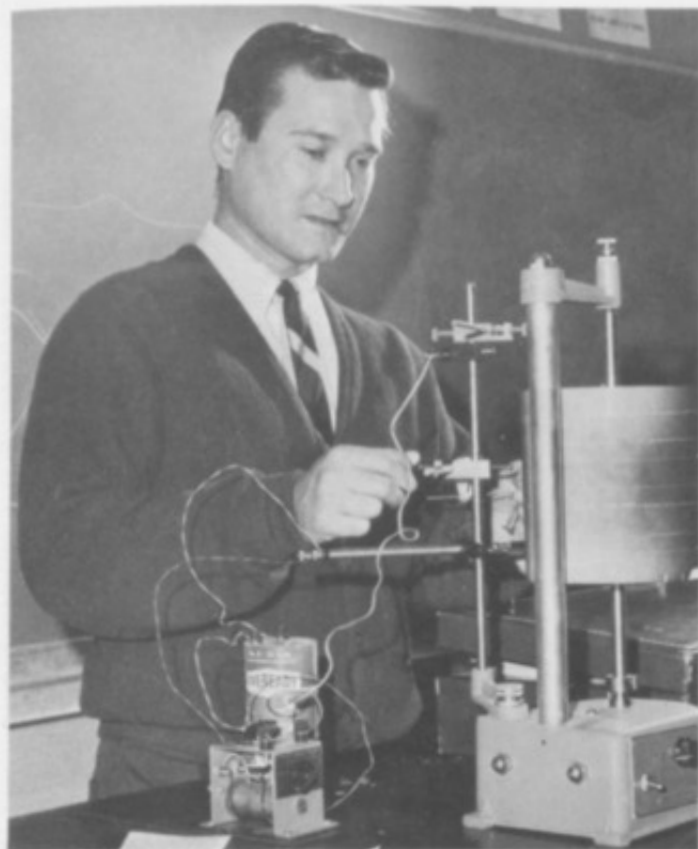
Mr. Rouget teaches Agriculture I-IV and Wood Shop. This is his second year in this system. He sponsors the F.F.A.

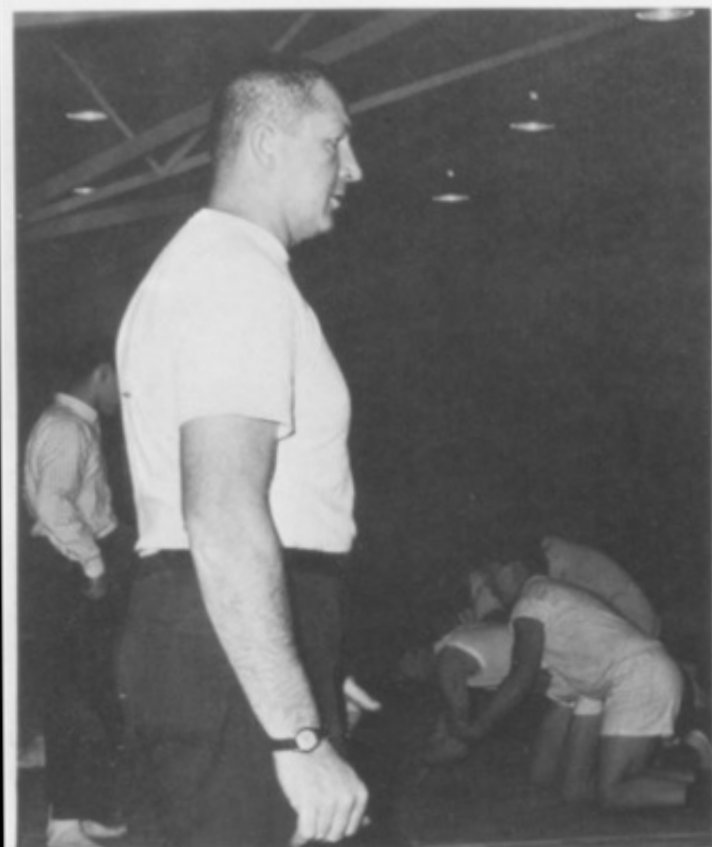


MR. CHARLES CLARK

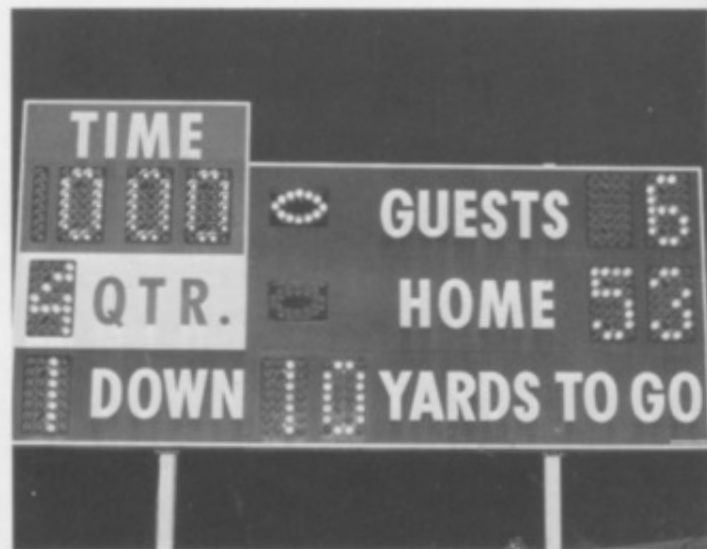
