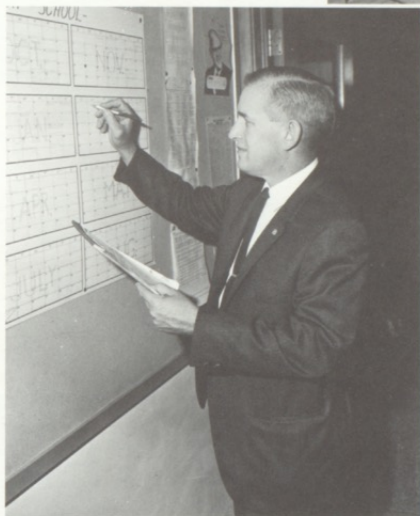

## New Course Added In Physics

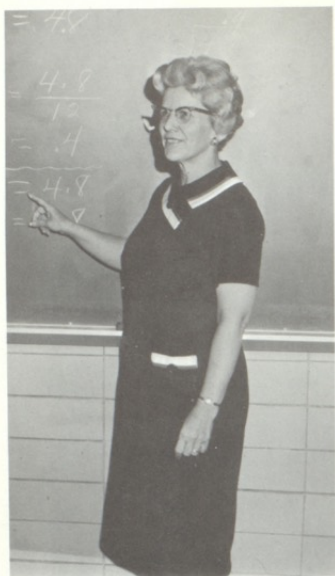

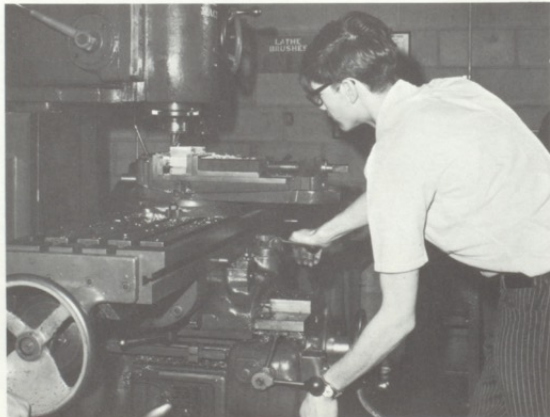

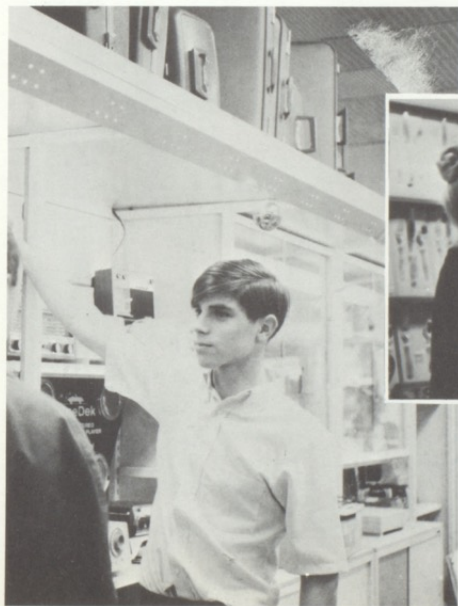

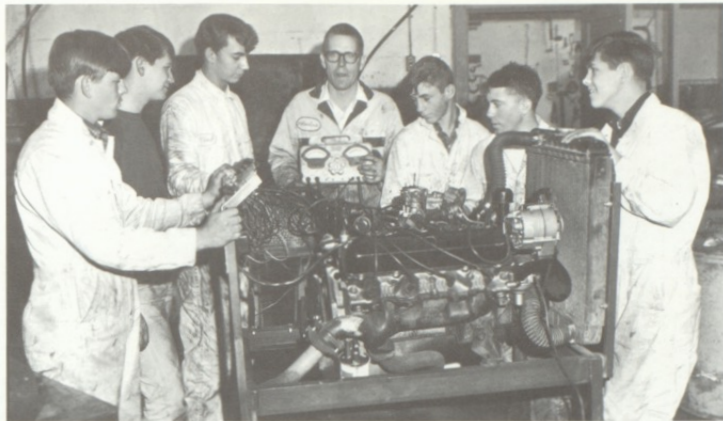

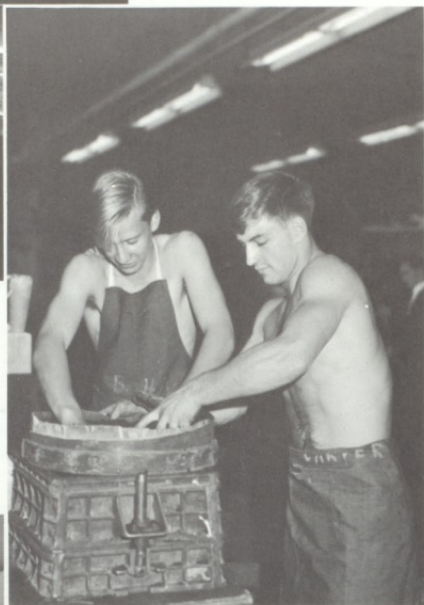
