

Young Team Looks Ahead


Coach Carroll Moon led this year's Junior Varsity Squad to an overall record of 3-6, making for a brighter season than in previous years.



Playing in the SMAA League for the first time, the boys set the pace by capturing the league title.




















Zabonick Named Class C "Coach of the Year"

Homecoming "82" What a Blast!







1983 saw the initiation of the Quiz Bowl, a non-athletic competition involving the schools of the Southern Michigan Athletic Association. The first match against St. Phillip was lost 150 to 100 and the second match against Olivet was lost by a very close 35-point margin in the final moments of playing time. As the team gained confidence they wanted yet another opportunity to compete before school closed and scrimmaged against Maple Valley, winning with a remarkable show of strength.
