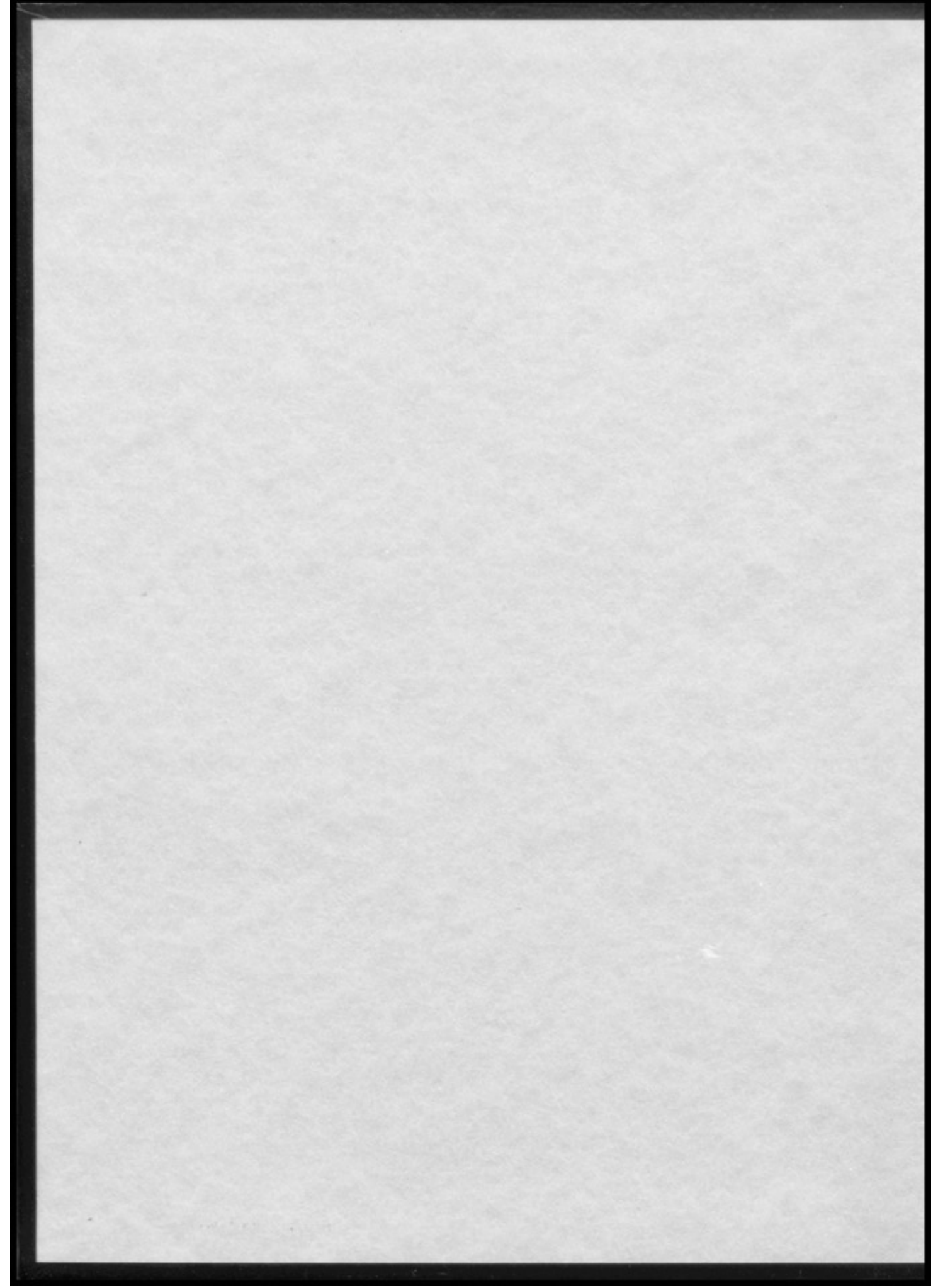

We had to earn \$4,000, so off we ran, grasping car keys to make our yearbook happen by selling ads.

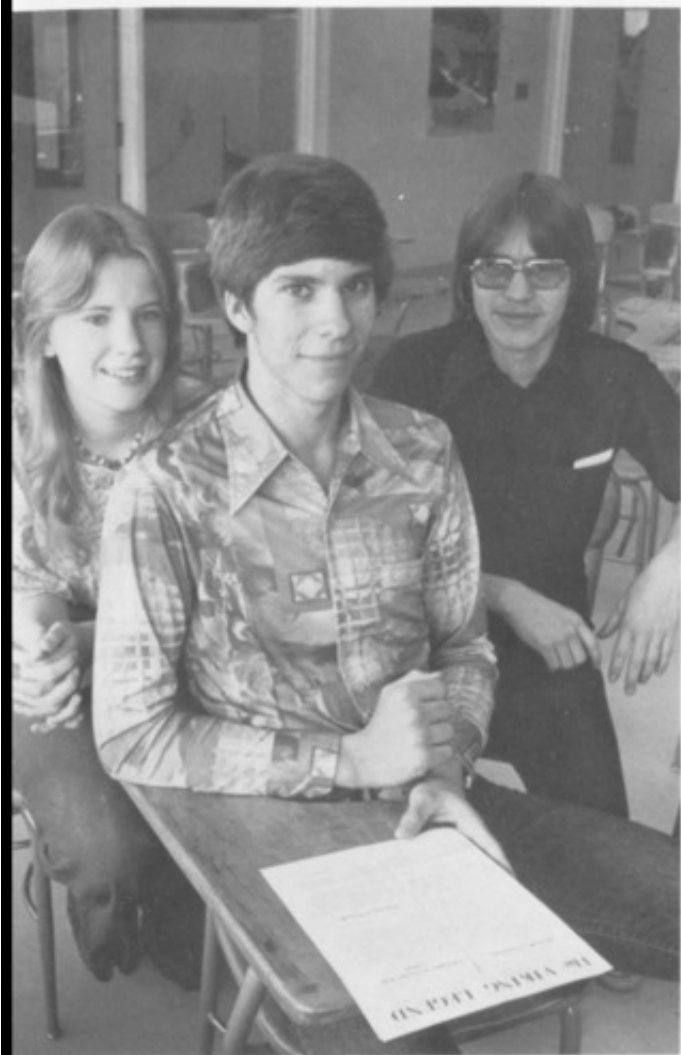
Events came and went and staff members armed with cameras were present to capture every thrilling moment in a lasting memory.

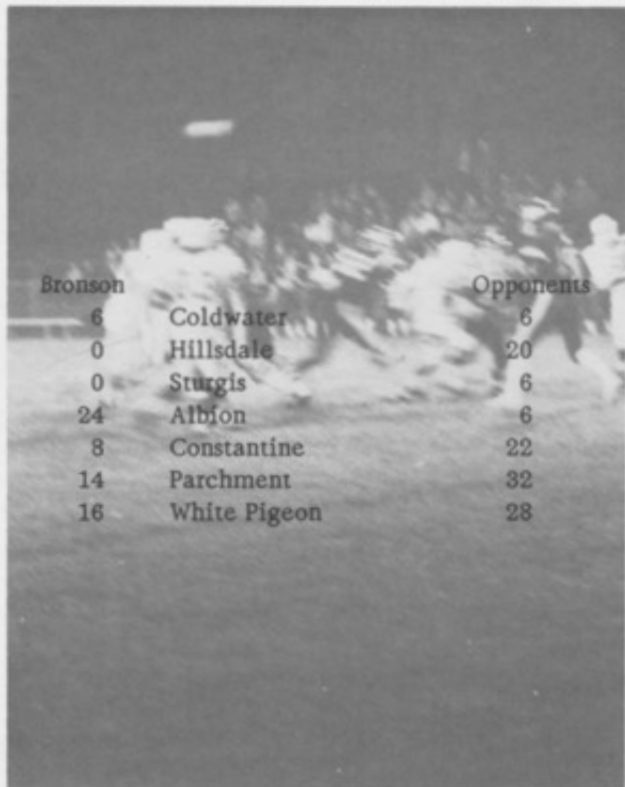
The Viking JV Football team showed this year that things are looking up. Improving their record, the future looks bright for this squad, and they have high hopes for next year.

Last year at this time our baseball team had just won the State Baseball Title, ending a season of 20-5. However, this year they weren't far behind, as they went all the way to the semifinals.

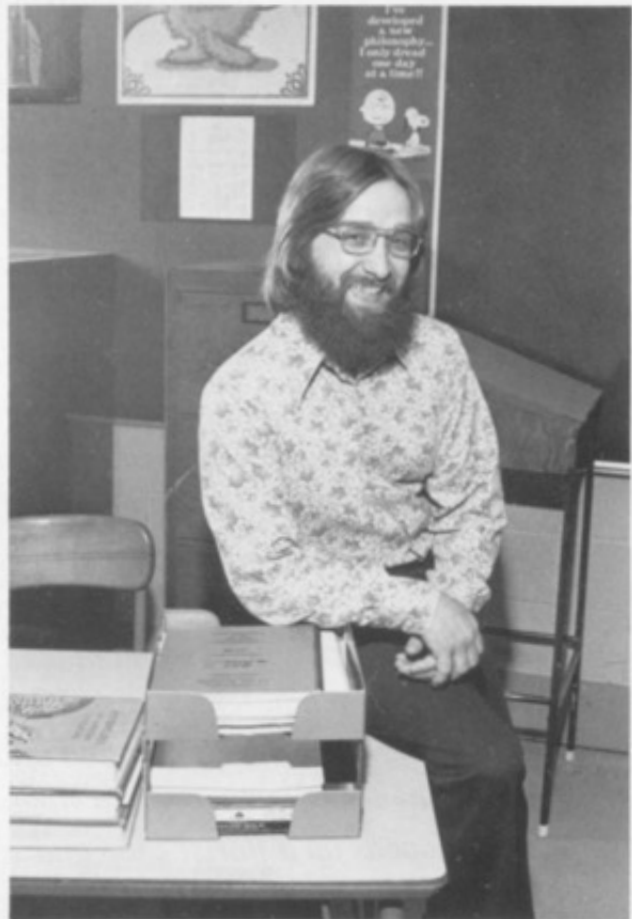
