We had to earn \$4,000, so off we ran, grasping car keys to make our yearbook happen by selling ads.


Events came and went and staff members armed with cameras were present to capture every thrilling moment in a lasting memory.










Varsity Football

This year we were lucky to have many veteran seniors and we are sorry to see them leave. In spite of the many injuries, the final record was: 4 wins and 5 losses.










Homecoming 75 A Very Colorful Event





TROPICAL PARADISE



"Nigel" supplied the music for the evening, playing until midnight.



Last year at this time our baseball team had just won the State Baseball Title, ending a season of 20-5. However, this year they weren't far behind, as they went all the way to the semifinals.


