Since the year 1968, Coldwater High School has witnessed the graduation of over 5,000 students, not to mention the stays of some 95 foreign exchange students, all under the supervision of three very special Principals, Mr. Kermit Dennis, Mr. C. Lester Luce, and presently the administration of Dr. Stanley Bushouse.

The students and faculty members have watched on as the Vietnam war escalated and fell. They have seen the steps in history as the footprints of the first astronauts were embedded in the stony surface of the moon, the changing role of Blacks in our society, the embarassment to us as a nation as the Warergate scandal was uncovered, the gret oil and gas shortage of the mid 1970's, the celebration of our nations 200th birthday, the increasing tension in the middle East in the form of American hostages in Iran, the 1980 U.S. boycott of the Olympics, a result of Soviet intervention in Afghanistan, the colossal eruption of the Mr. St. Helen's volcano, the first woman Vice-Presidental candidate of a major parties' ticket, the discovery of the Titanic, once thought to be lost at sea forever, and most recently Coldwater High School students mourned the loss of seven American Lives aboard the space shuttle Challenger only a little more than a minute after lift off, making a total loss of ten American Astronauts since 1968. Indeed, Coldwater High School students have witnessed a lifetime of history in only 18 short years.

The appearance of Coldwater High School has changed radically. Students during this period were the first to park their cars on a paved lor, the first to mix chemicals and check out library books in the new science and library wing, the first to look outside from behind the new windows, the first to place their books in the new lockers and the first to sit on the new bleachers and cheer on their favorite foorball team. The appearance of students competing on the floor of our gym changed radically, no longer were boys the only students able to compete in a variety of sports related activities, another radical change existed in the form of (gasp!) 9th graders roaming the halls of Coldwater High School, making the transition from the Legg Middle School building to our own High School accompanied by a variety of fine new
 teachers.

## TEACHER RECOGNITION . . .

ANNE HAYES


When one thinks of Coldwater High School another institution comes to mind - that which represents the entity of Anne Hayes. Since she began teaching in 1946, she has provided caring and understanding toward her students. "TEACHER" rarely comes to mind when one refers to Anne Hayes, but the word "FRIEND" seems for more applicable. This friendship has served as a special bond between her and her students. This bond has served to break the traditional student/reacher stereorypical image.

This year marks the 38th year of guidance that Mrs. Hayes has given to literally thousands of students. In the past she has taught courses in journalism, creative writing, expository writing, debate/forensics, civics, independent reading, practical writing. literary philosophy, and all levels of English except advanced placement English. Her guidance has extended itself in the form of extracurricular activities. There is hardly an activity in which Anne Hayes hasn't been involved in some form or another.

Not one of her students will ever be able to forget the reossurance of her smile, the stolwartness of her friendship.
or the feeling of genuine love one gets when standing close. When other reachers suffer whot is known as "teacher burnout," it's comforting to know that Anne Hayes hasn't changed much over the year's - but has only improved. She could very well be the "Babe Ruth of reaching." If words were merely adequare to describe Anne Hayes, they would be beauty, caring. and understanding.

The words of Anne Hayes speak for themselves:
"For thirty-eight years, next to my family and fishing, teaching has been the most important part of my life. In fact, I find that reaching is very much like a family structured sociery:
'Every young person that I have had at Coldwater High School has been like my own. Each one has been unique. Each one has made life just a little more pleasant though at times, sad. I have experienced joy, frustration, anger, but underlining all these feelings has been love. Whether that youngster be a rebellious individual, or a quiet subdued one who sirs quierly each day obsorbed in his own world, I have loved each for his/her individuality and personality.

Teaching is not a mass production
industry to me. I have preferred to look at the single product, at what that individual is, nor what orhers have painred him to be - and not whether he/she comes from such and such fomily.

The pleasure has come from seeing each of these delighrful individuals mature into productive active cirizens. Hoving rought in the 40 's, $50^{\prime}$ 's, 60's, 70 's, and now the 80's, I have seen MANY!

Working with these young people on many other activites and seeing them become responsible young leaders has also been an exciting part of my teaching career.

Although reaching may seem redious to some, I have found it to be the most exciting career I could ever have. Working with these delightful young people has kept me young and has given me a sense of achievement no other profession could give me. Certainly, it is a great deal of work but it has been worth every bit of the time and effort spent."
