things I know not of.

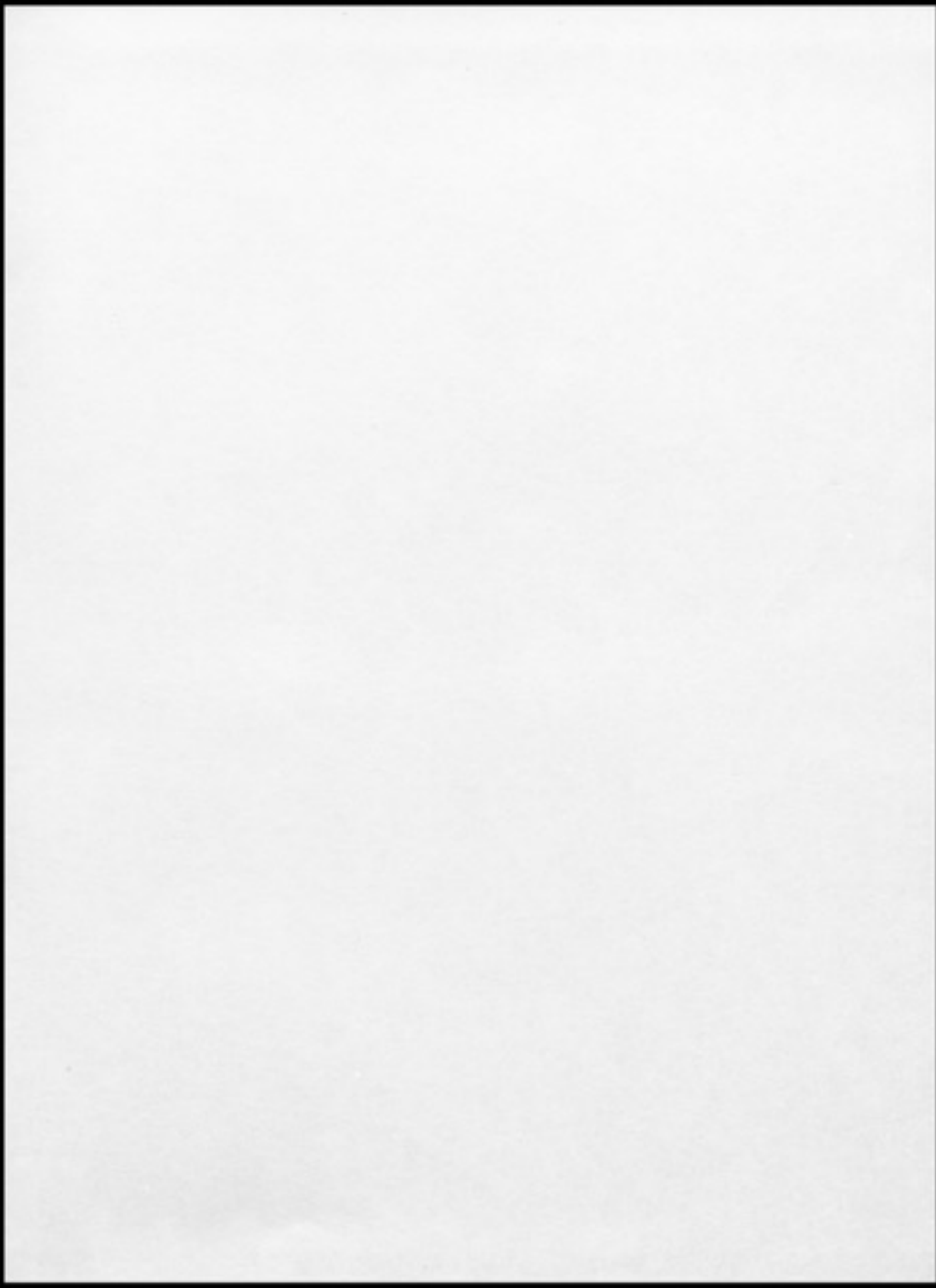

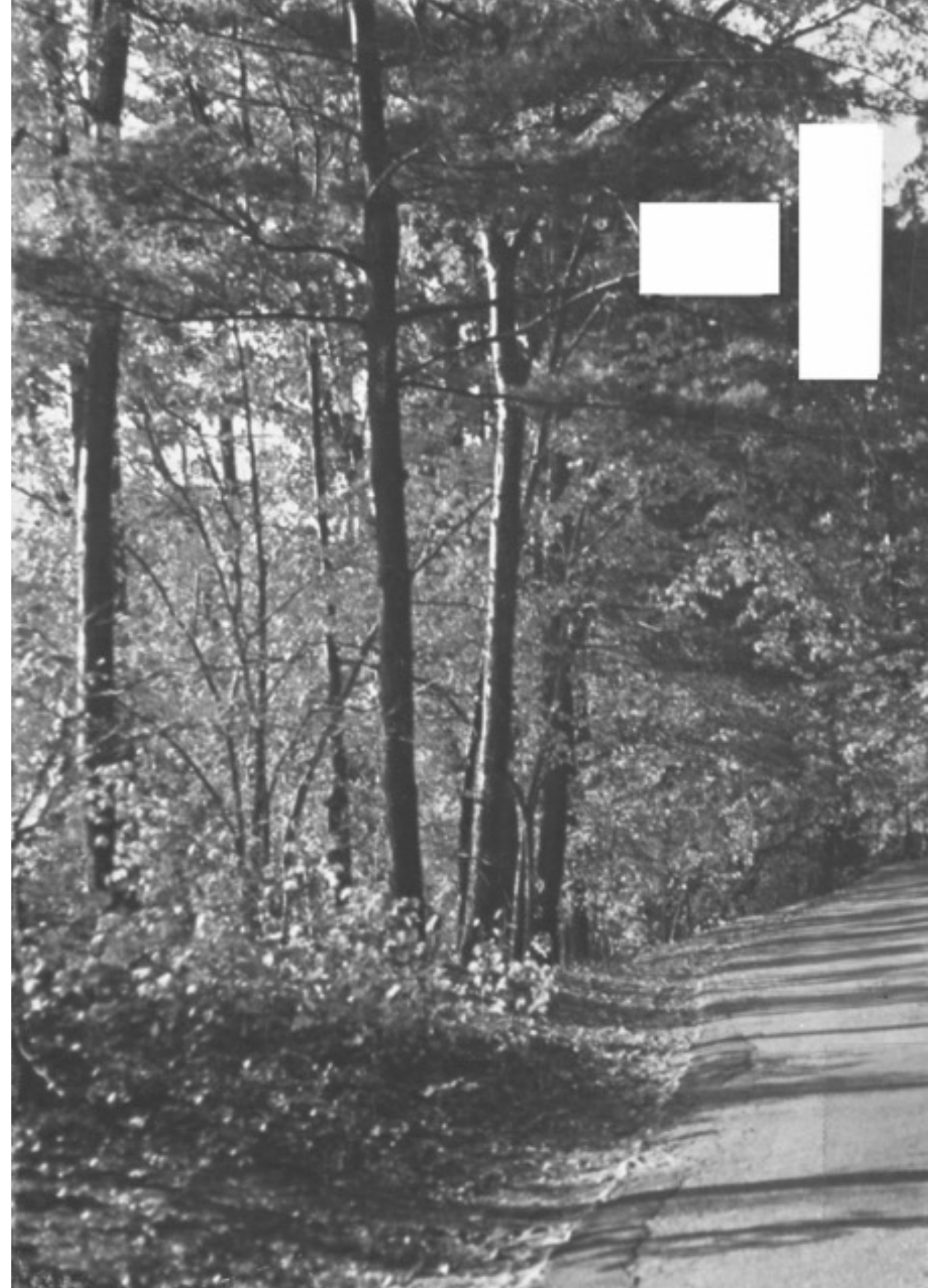

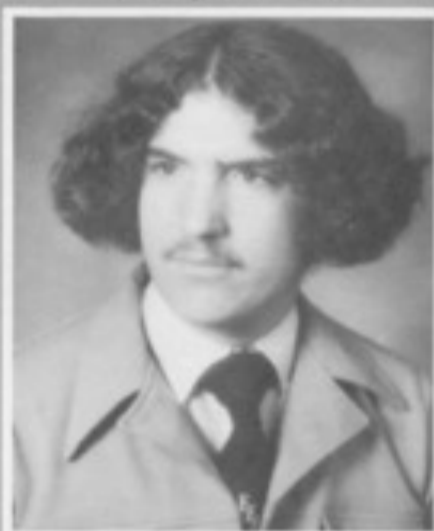
