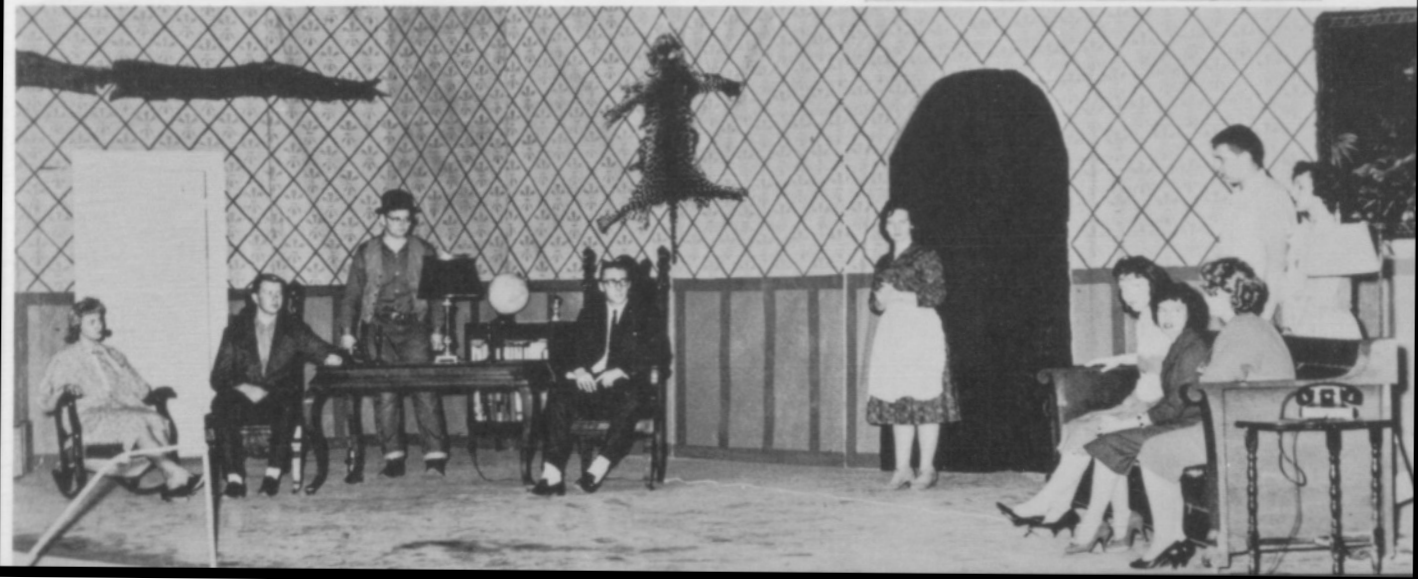

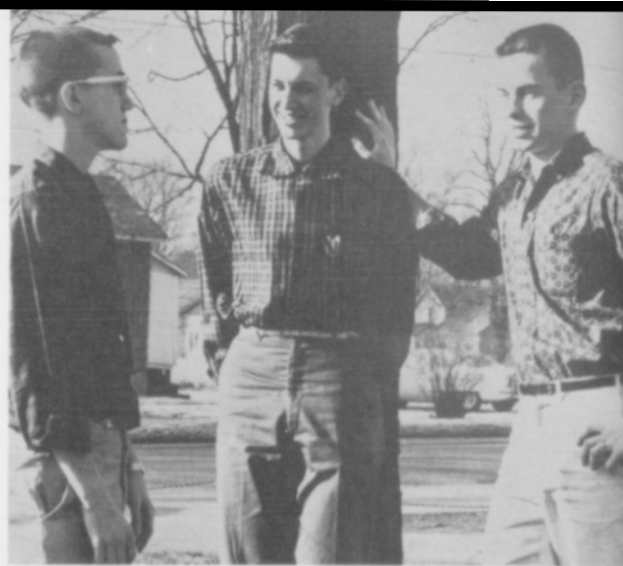

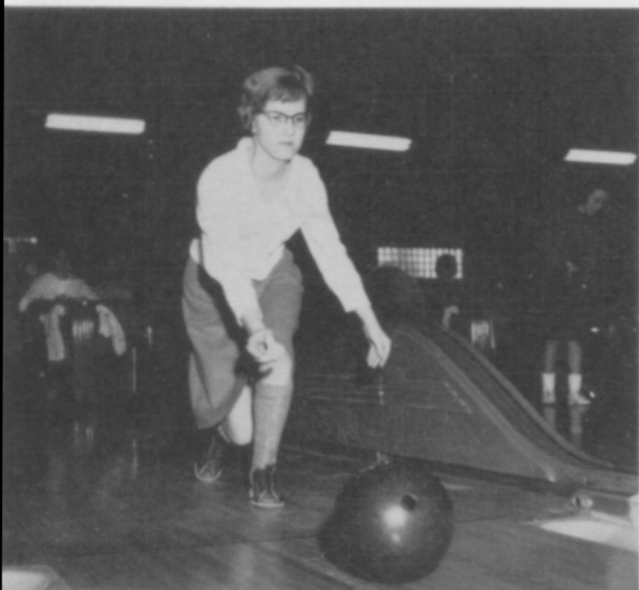

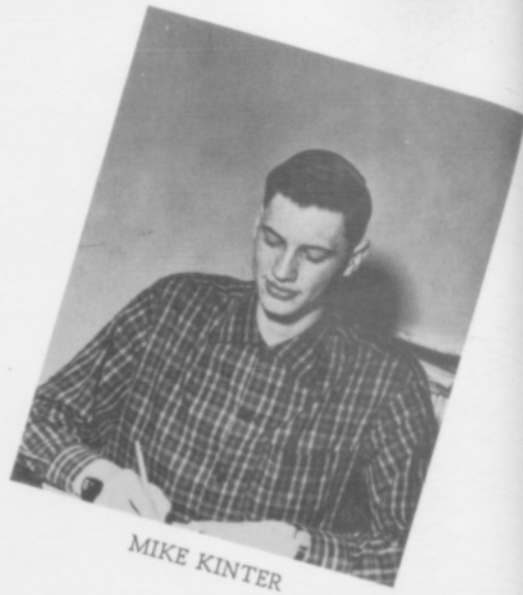

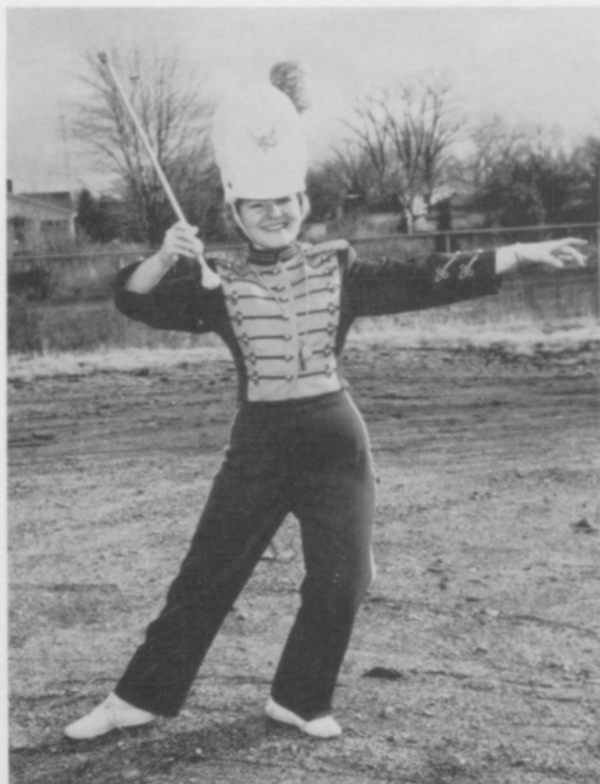

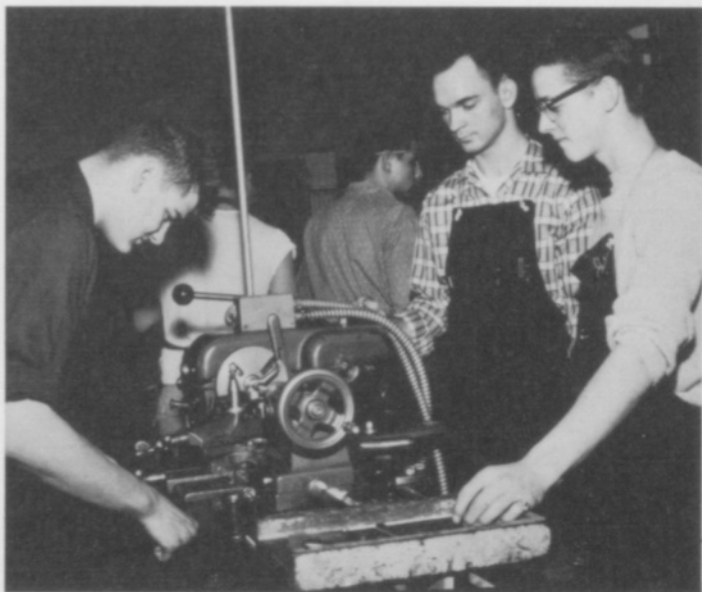
## Vocations Veer Toward Future

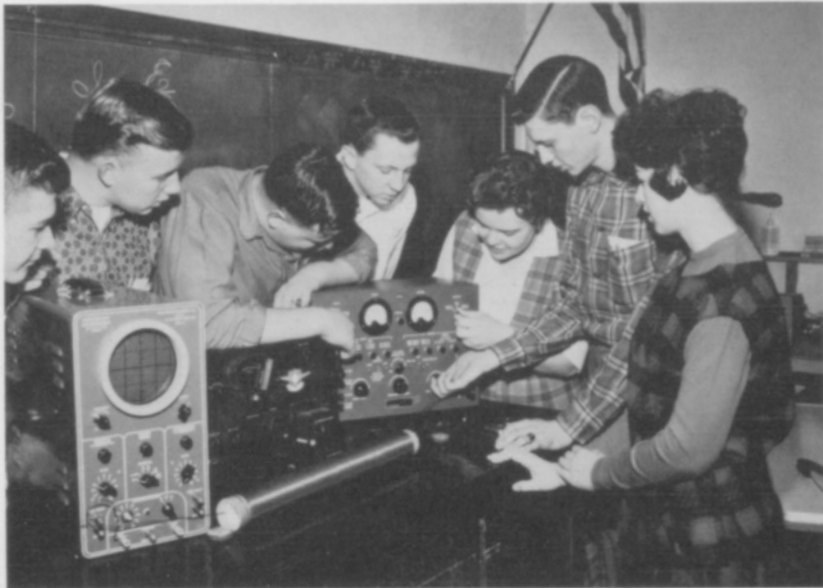

Teaching these subjects are Mr. Brusak, Mr. Kinsey, Mr. Whitcomb, and Mr. Atkocunis.

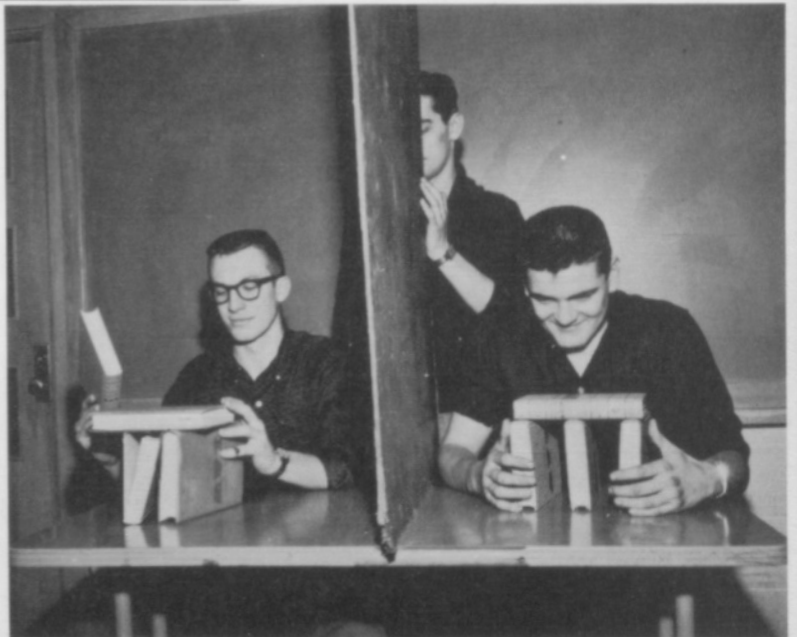

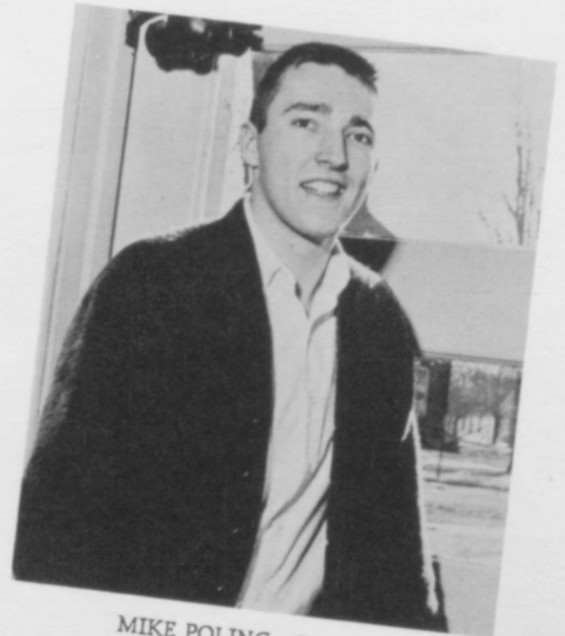
## Vikes Have Tough Luck Season

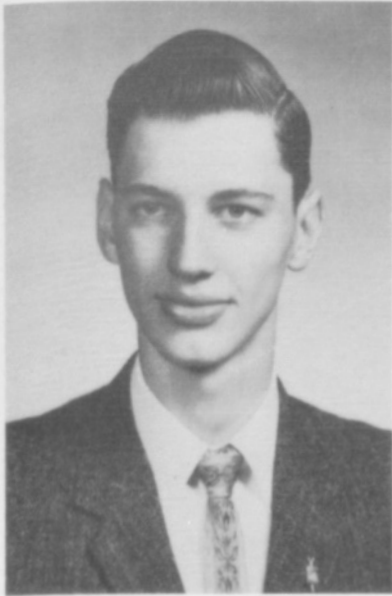
