## Jay Vee Gridders Lay an Egg

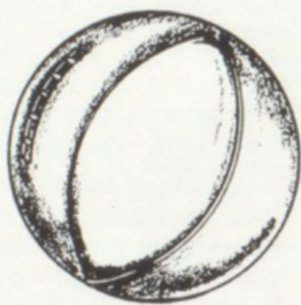

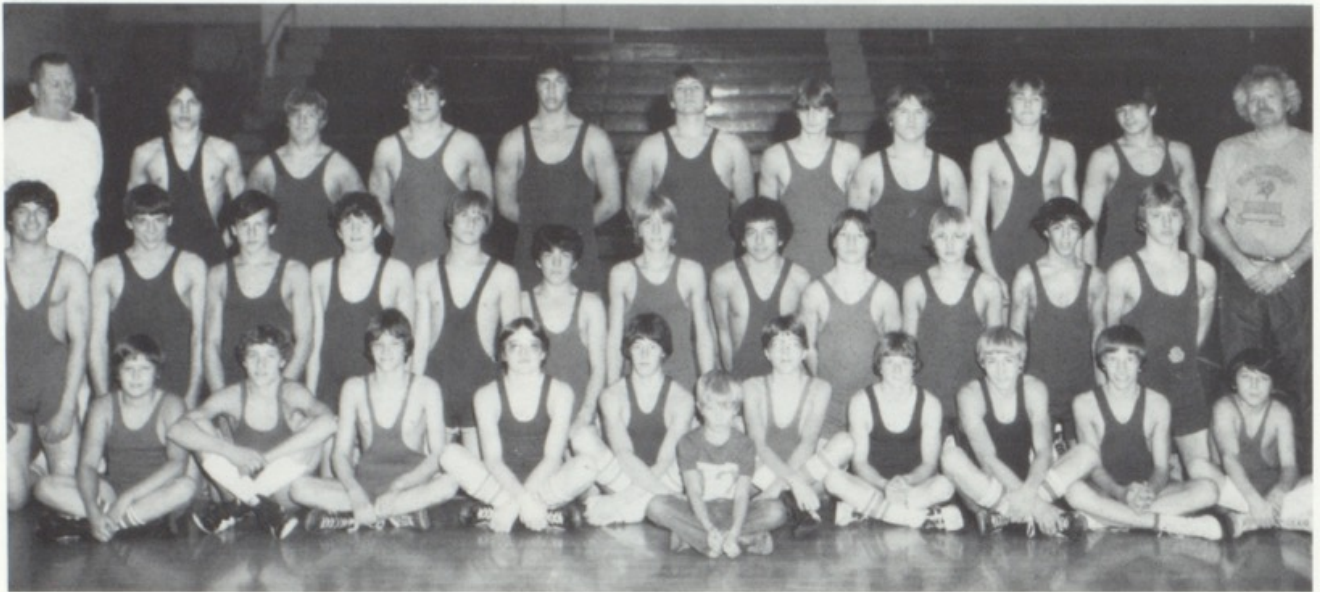

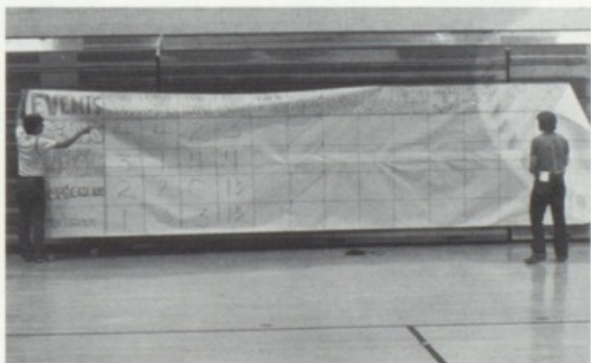
