












Power to the Vikes



Chairman for the week's activities was Bryan Smoker who was assisted by several committees to make the annual event a success.
































LAND OF MAKE BELIEVE




Student-Faculty Game






Varsity Sluggers Build Team Work










Determined JayVee Hitters
