The last weeks of school with Gov't. term papers due, final exams, Cedar Point, and graduation preparations flew by like minutes.
















Although the football team didn't beat the opponents on Homecoming, memory holds it as one of the most exciting nights during the school year.

The boys' team got off to a slow start, but managed to pull out a couple of tourneys. Team members look forward to a much better season next time, now that their status as "Rookies" is over.


