She has a quiet way of getting things done, and lots of her friends look up to her. She's tops as a good student and girl. Co-Valedictorian.

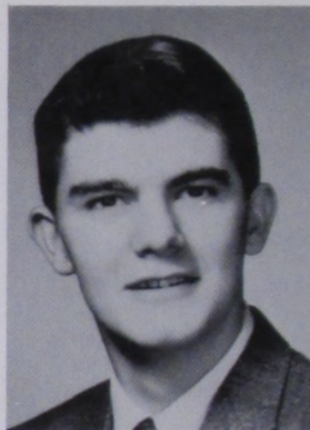
SANDRA LEE WEIDERMAN

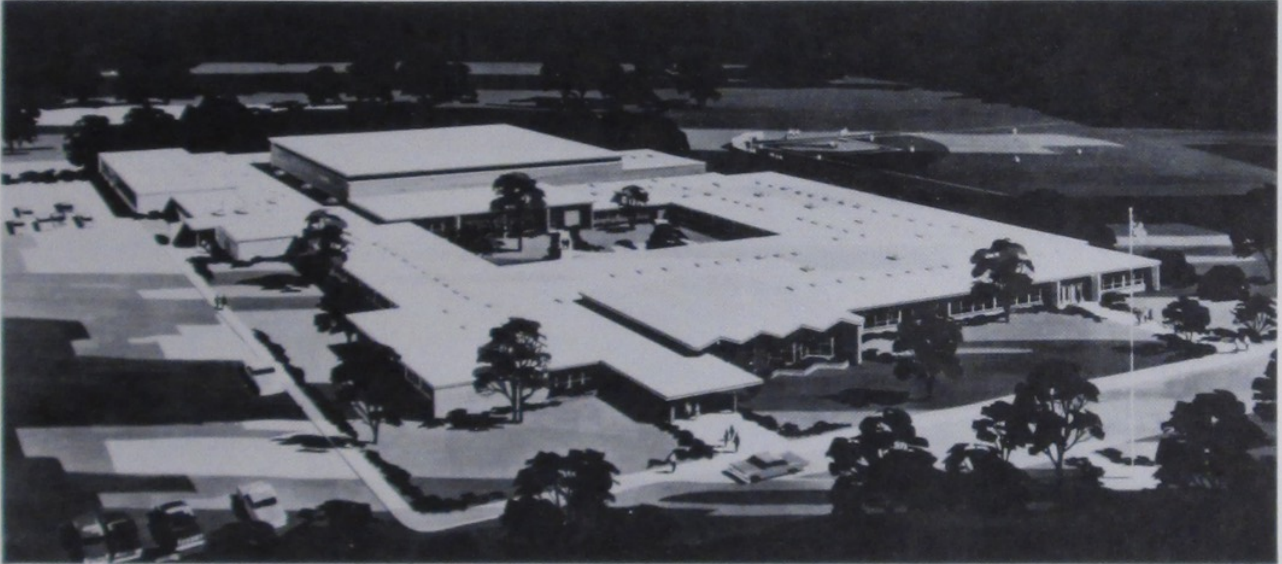
