

















































### QUINCY GETS THE BELL!

Yes, high school days are precious, but, oh so brief, where we thought all our dreams would come true.



### **QUINCY COMMUNITY SCHOOLS**



The Council was active with Homecoming, Magazine Drive, Donut Days, Oriole Week, Assemblies, Trike Race and Tug of War


The Student Council sponsored the new computer, a first at Quincy, which is a source of pride for many students. Students who have worked with this computer have found it to be a fascinating and educational experience.

























# HOW SWEET IT IS!
