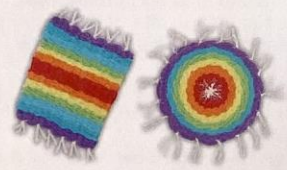
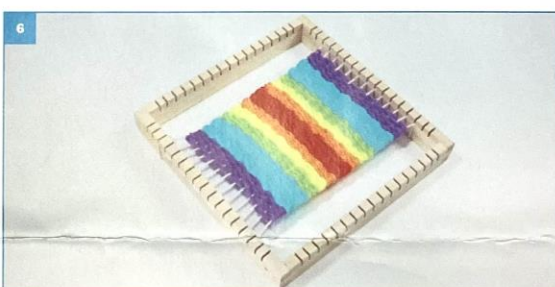
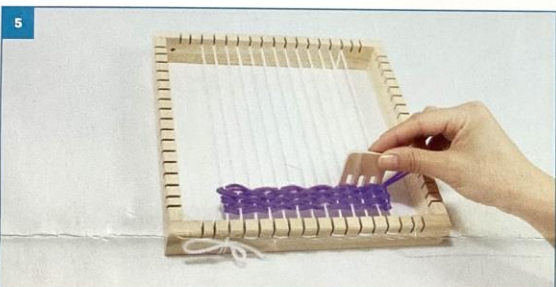
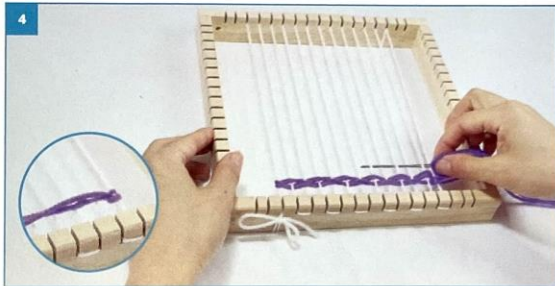
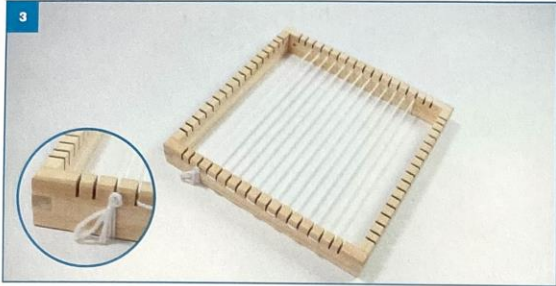
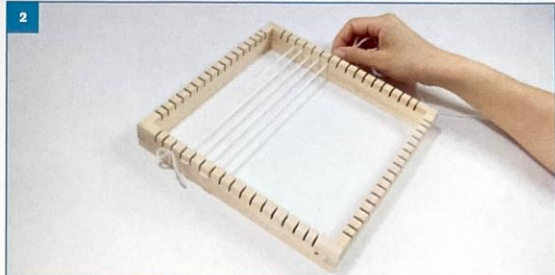
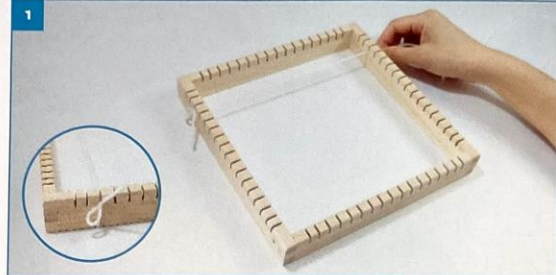
- String the weaving loom frame: Pull the warp thread through the small hole in the weaving frame and fix it with the adhesive tepe. Leave an additional diagonal length(approx.25 cm).
- Important: The warp thread is always pulled across two corners/gaps on the diagonal. This result in a warp clump (picture 3). String the weaving loom according to the directions of the arrows.


- Pull the originally reserved warp thread (approx.25 cm) to the middle and knot it. This creates an odd number of warp threads for weaving.
- Start weaving by passing the tapestry needle alternately under and over the warp threads.  
Tip: weave with the plied or single strand yarn as desired.
- Slide the woven yarn close to the already created weaving. Create your own pattern with the different colors of the yarn. Finish the weaving by taking the yarn out of the tapestry needle and knotting it with a warp thread. Then pull the yarn back and saw it.
- Now lift two warp thread up and knot them. Important: lift the next two warp threads up one after the other and knot them until all warp threads are knotted. Knot the last three warp threads together.
- Cut the knot fringes so that they follow the curve.
- Non-essential steps: If you want to get a smoother crafts, you can steam the woven item with iron.
