About BDL

Formed in 1991, Branch District Library (BDL) serves more than 46,000 residents of Branch County, Michigan, and neighboring Allen Twp. of Hillsdale County. The Library is comprised of six locations around Branch County. BDL, an independent unit of local government under Michigan law, is governed by a seven-member Board of Trustees, appointed by the Branch County Board of Commissioners and the City of Coldwater.

BDL currently serves more than 14,000 active cardholders with a collection of over 108,000 items housed in our six branches, and a digital collection of almost 2 million items. The library also offers a variety of services to our patrons: access to computers, wireless Internet, mobile printing, free notary and fax service, great programs and events for all ages, and so much more.





With nearly 160,000 checkouts last year, many thousands of items are checked out only a small number of times, or even just once. These are the highly popular items that stand out in that list.


For the fourth year in a row, People magazine is the most popular item overall, and for the fourth year, a title in the Diary of a Wimpy Kid series is the most popular kid's book.

BDL's choice for the 2024 One Book, One County reading event, Remarkably Bright Creatures, was our most popular adult fiction book by quite a large margin.






