"Get Out the Vote" Poster Contest

The freedom to vote is the hallmark of our democracy. It is both a privilege and a civic duty. Yet, in recent elections, only 64% of voting-age citizens voted. Kidsplace at the Branch District Library's Coldwater branch sponsored a 2012 "Get Out The Vote" Poster Contest to help promote the power of voting in the upcoming November election.

Criteria: For students grades 1-12. The poster design, including visuals and any accompanying text, had to be NONPARITISAN. Submissions could not support a specific party, candidate, or issue. Designs were to support only American's system of civic participation. Submissions considered to be partisan or offensive were not allowed to enter in the final selection nor were they publicly displayed.

Poster Specifications: Size: 14"Wx 11"H (half sheet of poster board)

Posters were to be submitted by Friday, November 2nd. Submissions were judged by Senator Bruce Caswell on Monday, November 19th at 10:00 a.m.. There was one winner in each age group. Age groups were 6-8, 9-12, and 13-15.
