

It's hard to believe but the Summer Reading Program has finished for another year. Here in Kids', we enrolled a total of 621 young people with 191 completing the program.

Scheduled Programming for ages 2-12 years: 20 programs over the six weeks with a total of 1128 participants. This is an approximate number as staff will testify it is very difficult to count large groups of moving people. This averaged out to 56 people per event.

The Garden Club "Dig into Gardening" regular Wednesday programming was very successful with approximately 591 people attending. We had 33 children complete the extra Garden Club reading requirements. They received an actual garden tool and a bag of gummy worms. All those in attendance received bags of candy, a fair pass, crazy bread coupon and a free book.

The Monday Laptime for ages birth-2 years hosted a total of 92 children and adults for the six weeks of Summer Reading. We will continue to host Monday Laptimes for the remainder of the summer.

Tuesday Theme Story & Craft times hosted 150 people with the most popular theme being our Dinosaur Dig day followed by our Construction theme. If it involves digging, they will come!

Popular Saturday events were Michigan Snake & Amphibians and the Construction Truck Petting Zoo. The School of Rock presentation was well attended with the turn out for our Comic magic less than expected. However, those in attendance had a great time!

We look forward to sharing a visual presentation of our summer with you at the September board meeting.

Kids' Place also hosted the Coldwater Parks program groups throughout the summer with stories & crafts. We hosted a total of 113 people for the 5 visits.

We can not say enough regarding all the corporate sponsors and individuals who made this summer possible. There is no doubt that we experienced the power of community this summer in Kids'. Not only were we blessed with financial help (no library monies spent!) but we had individuals (Garden Club) give of their time each week to share with our young patrons.


