Since my last report...

The custom matching end panels for Union Twp. Branch arrived, and we met the carpenter with all his gear to install them and modify the trim...only to find that the panels were delivered in the wrong height. We had to send them back and 6 weeks later finally got them installed this past weekend. The trim is now expertly cut to closely fit around the panels, top and bottom. The final bill for the carpentry came in \$200 cheaper than we had budgeted for.



- All of the gear approved for this year's computer purchasing was ordered and has arrived. Prep for deployment is underway.
- The Director's Office renovation/Coldwater office chairs project is mostly finished. The reactions to the office fixtures and furnishing have been quite positive, especially from the new occupant—which is exactly what I was hoping for! The projector screen hasn't arrived yet, though Kendrick's is working on sorting that issue out. As soon as that final piece, the balance of the approved funds will be used for replacing worn out chairs as we discussed. I'm optimistic for being able to replace at least ten chairs.

A related bill from Ludwick Electric for \$3,637.91 was paid to do work in the director's office, finish the elevator camera installation, and some work associated with the fire alarm installation.

- On July 27th we had an upgrade of our Evergreen system. This was easily the smoothest upgrade we've had in the 8 years we've been running this automation system. Our host—Equinox Software, Inc.—has really streamlined the process. What took us a long weekend 8 years ago took only a couple hours of downtime this time around. I haven't had a chance to explore all the new features just yet, but look forward to doing so.

Many thanks to Gina for keeping the stats going the past year and a half and for providing the springboard for the new look and feel.
