## Stitching for Friends of the Bronson Library

Fran Fletcher of Bronson makes quilts the old-fashioned way. She takes bits and pieces of material and hand stitches them into works of art.

Handcrafting quilts is her thing, so Fletcher has often donated one to the annual Friends of the Bronson Library quilt raffle. She has also entered her creations into quilt shows.

This year, for the library raffle, Fletcher created a quilt that looks like a bookshelf complete with a 3-D teddy bear sitting on a stack of books, a couple kittens snoozing and a bird in a cage.

This is the second time Fletcher made a bookshelf quilt and they are probably the most popular for the library raffle, said Lynnell Eash Bronson librarian. In the past, the fundraiser has brought in \$600 to \$800, "but my goal this year is \$1,000," Fletcher said.

Tickets are \$1 each and the raffle will be held in September. The quilt in on display at the Bronson Branch of the Branch District Library.

As for quilt shows, Fletcher has entered two of her favorites into a juried quilt show
