

Didn't we just have a meeting?? With the holidays, the time between the December and January meetings always seems so brief! The holidays at the library are at times slow and quiet, and a times a blur of activity with kids out of school. As you'll see from our branch reports, some locations are seeing an increase in youth attendance finally.

As you know, the State of Michigan is requiring all local governmental units, which includes libraries, to adopt a Universal Chart of Accounts. Our accountants have our UCA ready; however, they won't be giving it to us to use until after the close out of the 2021 books and audit, to ensure that 2021's numbers stay consistent. They don't want to risk changing codes in their system as the audit is happening. So we'll have to use the old chart of accounts for the first month or so, then re-code everything after the audit.

Speaking of audits...I reported last month on how impressed I was at how staff and handled the so-called "First Amendment Auditors" in our library in December. You can see for yourself, since they finally posted their video of us. They had a number of negative interactions around Coldwater, including the part of this video after the library, but the video shows how our staff didn't make a fuss. I hesitate to post this link to get them more views, which is clearly their goal, but I'm just really proud of staff handling this according to our training on the topic.




Our Event Guide, after a two-year pandemic-induced hiatus, is back! Major kudos to all the managers and programming coordinators for getting so many great events and activities scheduled in advance. It's a lot of work, but families are very appreciative to have all this great info at a glance to plan. And huge thanks to Kimberly for all the work she puts into the production of the guide. She makes it look easy, but I assure you it's not! I applied for, and received, a grant for programming equipment from The Library Network cooperative, leveraging ARPA funds. We will be receiving a laptop, video camera, microphone, tripod, green screen, webcam, speaker system and microphone, weather canopy, and carrying container. The items were valued at about \$3000.

I completed the State Aid report, a task that seems to take longer each year. We might need to modify our internal statistical report a little for 2022 to account for some of the new questions being asked. Amazingly, the State has still not released the final per capita numbers for State Aid to libraries. I assume they will have sorted this out by the time checks start going out in the spring.

Our new Outreach Manager, Cheryl Lawrence, has hit 2022 running hard on the bookmobile project. She already has schematics from two vendors and is working on getting formal quotes together that we can bring to the Public Services Committee by the end of the 1st Quarter. She is working on a number of other outreach and bookmobile logistical angles as well, and all



before she's actually able to fully transfer into her new position! As things progress further, she'll begin adding her own reports to the packet.



Our previous library website was about 10 years old and was in need of some attention. The update, originally planned for summer to coincide with our logo update, finally went live on January 1 (shown at left). Along with a new look look and color scheme to match the new logo, this design is optimized for mobile devices, and we reorganized the layout based upon user feedback and no small amount of inspiration from other major libraries' web sites that we love. The software running the website has numerous new features, too, which we will leverage over time as we get acquainted with the new toolkit. Many thanks to the marketing and IT teams for all their work on this many-months'-long project.

A Union City insurance agent expressed interest in applying for the open BDL Trustee for Union Twp. I left a voicemail with him to see if I could answer any questions he might have. The County has not received his application at any rate. I'll share more as I know it.

I have been in touch with Anne Seurynck about getting the ball rolling for August's planned ballot measure for the millage renewal. Friends groups are aware from our annual meeting a couple months back, and we'll be leveraging them more as we get closer. Kimberly and Jessica did a millage workshop a few months back, and we'll be doing a month-long millage series of workshops in March with Anne.

Meetings in the last month: Branch County Commissioners, Coldwater DDA, Algansee Friends of the Library, and Michigan Library Directors.

By the time we meet, we should have interviewed about 6 people for the two open Coldwater service desk positions. We're optimistic about getting people onboard with us soon.

As you'll see in her report this month, Keeley Briggs has tendered her resignation to move on to a position in Lansing with the Michigan Library Association. I am grateful to Keeley for being a steady hand during this time of pandemic and for leaving a positive imprint on the library from programming to policy recommendations. She has set a great example for both being organized and methodical in a busy environment, and especially for treating young people with respect and dignity. We wish her all the best!!


