Millage News

I delivered the certified resolution starting the millage process to the Branch County Clerk. All was in order, and we are a go for the August 2 ballot. There will be no charge to the library to be on this ballot.

During our staff in-service day, the branch managers joined Kimberly and me for the last session of our millage workshop, which provided a recap of the whole process and focused heavily on the dos and don'ts of promoting a millage.

One of the "don'ts" regards how much involvement library staff or trustees may have on any vote-yes committees. The answer is basically none. Jeanne Berg has graciously agreed to help us form a yes committee. She will be contact library supporters involved in 2014, in addition to current library Friends and other supporters to form this vital committee which will be independent of the library.

Going Fine-Free

Today's *Daily Reporter* shared a story of Michigan libraries going fine-free. While the article did not mention BDL as one of the first in the state to make this change, our experiences mirror what was reported in the article: "removing late fines had made no impact on metrics like wait times for popular books, how long materials were being kept, or the number of materials reported lost." 44% of Michigan libraries are now fine-free.

Staff In-Service

As noted elsewhere in this packet, our spring in-service day was March 28. In the morning we had a presentation from the Branch County Literacy Council, and from the staff in the Heritage Room. We then had refreshers on IT topics, our digital services, and customer service. For the afternoon we split up, with each branch taking care of spring cleaning to-dos on their own. Across the county, there was a lot of dusting, straightening, changing of lightbulbs, collection management, and more. It was a very successful day!

Library Staff News

There has been lots going on with library staff this past month.

Christina Holibaugh started with us as Branch Manger of the Coldwater Branch. You will get to meet her at the meeting Monday. She has wasted no time getting acquainted with the library and all we do. I'm very excited for the future!

Sarah Strong accepted our offer to become the new Quincy Branch Manager. She will start in May. One of her first duties will be to help select a replacement for Renee Hardy, our Quincy Clerk, who announced her retirement after 35 years at the library. Renee's last day will be the end of May.

Judy Gottschalk, current clerk and previous Branch Manager of the Union Twp. Branch also announced her retirement effective the end of April. Julie and I are currently working to hire a new clerk for this position.

We welcome Brandon Apmann to the library as our newest clerk. Brandon will be floating around the district as needed for now, helping with coverage on all the vacancies we currently have.

Speaking of that, the Algansee Branch Manager position remains unfilled at this time. We will continue to advertise for this opening. Lynnell is continuing to do double duty in the meantime, for which I am incredibly grateful!

I am also so grateful for all the time and effort Kimberly and Jessica have put in to keep things running smoothly and ensure a comprehensive training regimen for our new hires. This operation would simply not be the same without their diligent efforts.

FOIA Request

We received another Freedom of Information Act request from the same Florida data broker that has submitted several times previously. The request was fulfilled at no charge in accordance with our policy.

The BDL Teen Advisory Committee had decided some months ago that they saw themselves as a service club in addition to just advising on library events. 5 of them joined Sandi to volunteer at the Humane Society of Branch County all day Wednesday. A great way to help the community while learning about animal welfare!

Covid Update

We had a couple uses of our temporary leave policy this past month as we had one confirmed positive case in a staff member and one person who thankfully tested negative.

Materials Challenges

Related to what Kimberly reported on, books continue to be challenged and banned across the country. At our April meeting, 17% of Michigan libraries represented said that they had experienced an increase in challenges at their library. So far, this has not been the case at BDL.

Former Trustee Passing

With sadness, I report that Louie Uhrig, former BDL Trustee representing Bronson (2014-2016), passed away on April 6. <u>Obituary and details are online</u>.

Trustee Vacancies

We have another candidate for our vacant Board position representing Coldwater. I expect City Council to take this up before the May meeting. We continue to ask individuals in Union Twp. to fill that position, but have still not met with success.

We heard from the Branch County Literacy Council and the Holbrook Heritage Room. Other topics included IT review, digital services, and customer service. In the afternoon the spring cleaning began. The work on our next Event Guide (May/June/July) continued. It has been a process since as it was getting put together, we had presenters cancel or reschedule. In some cases, several times! It finally went to the printers earlier this week. Copies will be available at all branches soon.

National Library Week came and went. A special social media post was shared on Tuesday thanking our staff for all that they do at BDL! During National Library Week, the list of the Top 10 Most Challenged Books of 2021 is released. The American Library Association's Office for Intellectual Freedom tracked 729 challenges in 2021. This was an increase of 167% from the previous year. It is important to note that many challenges and possible banning of books go unreported.

- 2. Lawn Boy by Jonathan Evison
- 3. All Boys Aren't Blue by George M. Johnson
- 4. Out of Darkness by Ashley Hope Perez
- 5. The Hate U Give by Angie Thomas

- 6. The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-Time Indian by Sherman Alexie
- 7. Me and Earl and the Dying Girl by Jesse Andrews
- 8. The Bluest Eye by Toni Morrison
- 9. This Book is Gay by Juno Dawson
- 10. Beyond Magenta by Susan Kuklin

A special week is dedicated to this topic in September. Banned Books Week is an annual event celebrating the freedom to read. Stay tuned!
