Budget

Cheryl Lawrence, our outreach manager, attended the ALA Association of Bookmobile and Outreach Services (ABOS) conference this week in Scottsdale AZ, and has come back energized and full of ideas. On October 11, we held our staff in-service day. We had excellent presenters on providing good customer service from Zingerman's in Ann Arbor, and on conducting the reader's advisory interview from Novelist. 


