IT Happenings

- A months-long project to improve our Evergreen library system got fully deployed. Starting in December, Kimberly and I have been overhauling all the rules in Evergreen that implement our Borrowing and Lending Policy. It's a complicated beast, and hasn't been working as well as we'd like for a while. Happy to say, looks like it was a complete success!
- I had get up in the ceilings to rewire a few things at the Bronson branch because of the new privacy booth, and at the Coldwater branch because of the new printers.
- The copier at the Bronson library finally broke down and had to be replaced. Our copier service vendor delivered it this past week. The total was about \$4,000, within my spending authorization, and will be in a a future bills report.
- Curtis installed new public desktop computers to the Bronson branch, and laptops for staff and public use at 5 branches.

• Curtis and I have been deploying the new printers and are about halfway finished. I have donated one of the old printers and some supplies to the Children's Museum of Branch County.
