

## **Technical Services**



The top three most circulated items from the Library of Things collection were: Verizon Hotspots, Playway Launchpads (kids tablet), and the Potholder Loom Kit.


## **Marketing**

In June of 2023, we introduced a TikTok for BDL. For the 2023 year, our Facebook and Instagram page reach was up significantly.
