Personnel

As it turns out, the Quincy position is still open after all. We have conducted additional interviews this week, with more planned for next week. We had so many applications for the Quincy position that we have not reposted for the open Coldwater position but have been conducting interviews of candidates from that initial pool. Two temporary clerks have been hired for summer to cover parenting leave absences, with one more planned.

MERS Transition

It took some time to get Nationwide to respond to messages, but the transition is under way now. MERS has given us some great information packets, so we can start to have conversations with current Nationwide participants now, as well as schedule introductory visits for all staff to encourage wider participation.

MeLCat Celebrates 20 Years of Resource Sharing!

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Michigan eLibrary Catalog (MeLCat) and interlibrary loan service. Over the past two decades, the service has grown from 12 member libraries to more than 435 public, school, academic and special libraries. MeLCat has amassed holdings of over 34 million items.

Branch District Library has been a proud member of MeLCat since 2007. The goal of the Michigan eLibrary (MeL) is to provide equitable access to a comprehensive array of high-quality information resources for Michigan residents. Using MeLCat as a discovery tool fosters collaboration among libraries and other organizations to enhance knowledge-sharing and ensure resources, including special, unique or historical materials, are available to all, regardless of geographic or economic barriers.

MeL and MeLCat receive support from the U.S. Institute of Museum and Library Services, administered by the State of Michigan through the Library of Michigan. The State of Michigan provides additional funding.

Hoopla Digital Library

For several years, the Woodlands Library Cooperative helped supplement BDL's annual funding for the highly popular Hoopla digital library service. However, in November of last year, the cooperative decided to discontinue its financial support. This change led to some challenges for our patrons in 2025, as the daily borrowing limit was being reached much earlier in the day. Patrons were calling the library regularly asking why their Hoopla wasn't working.

Thankfully, the 2025 budget included additional funds for Hoopla to purchase digital flex titles. Instead of using this money for new flex materials, it was allocated to increase the monthly budget slightly,, giving our patrons more time and opportunity to borrow materials. Hoopla remains popular service for our digital users.

Summer Reading planning is in full swing! Meagan has been busy creating flyers, social media posts, and calendars to help spread the word about our biggest event of the year!

New library cards have arrived including a nature-themed design and a special bookmobile card. The bookmobile card will be at all locations to promote our newest branch, though it won't be available
