Coloring sheets are being turned in and we've been busy registering readers for the Summer Reading Program.



The Bookmobile has officially been in service for one month, and it has gone very well! We have already attended many local events: Coldwater's Cultural Jubilee, Union City's Memorial Day parade, Branch County Community Field Day and Safety Fair, and Healthy Family Fun Day. At these events, we have been able to present the bookmobile to the public and answer many questions about it and its service to the community. We have also been able to issue new library cards, update some expired accounts, and checked out many items from the Bookmobile's shelves. This is just the start, as we have many more events yet to come for the summer!



Attendance at our current regular stops are still low, but we have seen a small increase at Coldwater Lake (2 new patrons) and California Twp (4 new patrons). I have completed the set-up process for our first seasonal location, Potawatomie Campground. We will make our first stop there on Thursday, June 26th. I have started a conversation with Waffle Campground about adding them to our seasonal schedule, but have not made any progress so far. My goal for this coming month is to start a similar conversation with a location in Allen township.

The Bookmobile will be going in for a small repair job on June 13th to fix the power to the passenger seat's adjustment controls, which are necessary for rotating the seat. Our volunteer will be assisting Brandon with this trip. I have also worked with this volunteer to schedule him for a few days coming up to help with driving and manning the Bookmobile during some staff time off.
