

Altrusa donates a new Storywalk for Waterworks Park

COLDWATER — Wednesday morning, along the banks of the Sauk River, members of Altrusa, Branch District Library, Coldwater Board of Public Utilities, and city staff dedicated the third Storywalk in the county.

Kids from the nearby Lincoln School Headstart cut the ribbon and then toured the trail, where city crews installed 18 signs on posts at children's height, each displaying a children's book in English and Spanish.

"Families and individuals can take a stroll through the beautiful park and read a lovely children's book while they enjoy the great outdoors," Library Assistant Director Kimberly Feltner said.

Books are changed quarterly with different stories.

The first book up in Waterworks is "The Very Hungry Caterpillar," which instructs the children to perform tasks like jumping like a Kangaroo.

Carol Hodson from Altrusa said of the international organization with hundreds of clubs, "We are all dedicated to service within our own communities, and our number one goal is literacy."

Members of the club presented the \$5,500 donations for the project to the city.

This Storywalk is the second in Coldwater, the groups installed the first in Heritage Park.

A third winds along the railroad at Quincy Village Park.
