Along with the new lights in the library, FM Electric of Quincy installed 3 white fans in the library. The lights and fans complement each other and are very attractive. Please make sure you look up the next time you visit the library. This lighting project was possible through a DeRoy Testamentary Foundation Grant, our capital fund money, a local donation, Quincy Township and through the cooperation of three entities. When we first conceived the idea, our President, Teddy Sinclair, called Bob Doll of Kendall Electric to help us get started. He was very helpful through the whole process.

Next came FM Electric, who ordered the new lights, took down the old lights and put up the new lights. Other than a non-working light bulb which took a long time to replace due to ordering difficulties, the work was done in short order. Then we were left with the holes in the ceiling where the old lights were. Teddy made a call to Legg Lumber and Jack came to our rescue. He repaired, molded and painted the areas needing repair and left us with a ceiling that looks better than ever.

Lisa said all the workers were quiet, courteous and cleaned up when they left. Thank you to the above mentioned people for completing this project. It has made a world of difference in the lighting and the looks of our library.

On a solemn note, after serving 35 years as a Quincy Library Board member, Bobbie Brickey has moved to Kalamazoo to be closer to her daughters. The Board will be having a reception to honor Bobbie when the weather warms up a bit. Jane Baldwin and Bobbie joined the Board in 1971 and 1972 respectively, and it is due to their love of the Quincy Library that we are in the shape we are today. The Board continues to strive to meet the challenges ahead as the Board did under their leadership Thank you Bobbie, for caring enough to make this library a priority in your life.


Meet the New Quincy Branch Liaison
