#### Adult non fiction

Edible Wild Plants: Wild Foods From Dirt To Plate by John Kallas. This book divides plants into four flavor categories -- foundation, tart, pungent, and bitter. Categorizing by flavor helps readers use these greens in pleasing and predictable ways. #### **Adult fiction**

Mystery: An Alex Delaware Novel by Jonathan Kellerman. Alex Delaware, the L.A. psychologist and crime-solver, returns to tackle another tricky case. A woman has been murdered, her body mutilated. Homicide detective Milo Sturgis, Delaware's frequent partner, brings Alex into the case, hoping for some insight into the psychology of the killer. Alex is surprised to discover that the victim is familiar to him; Alex and his girlfriend saw her at a restaurant only hours before her death. But how can Alex and Milo expect to find any usable clues when the restaurant is now out of business?

The Girl Who Played with Fire by Stieg Larsson. Lisbeth Salander once again finds herself paired with journalist Mikael Blomkvist on the trail of a sinister criminal enterprise. Only this time, Lisbeth must return to the darkness of her own past (more specifically, an event coldly known as "All the Evil") if she is to stay one step ahead--and alive.

The Bourne Dominion by Robert Ludlum. The Bourne Dominion is the ninth novel in the Bourne series. Jason Bourne is searching for an elusive cadre of terrorists planning to destroy America's most strategic natural resources-and needs the help of his longtime friend, General Boris Karpov. Karpov, the newly appointed head of Russia's most feared spy agency, FSB-2, is one of the most determined, honorable, and justice-hungry men that Bourne knows. But Karpov has made a deal with the devil. In order to remain the head of FSB-2, he must hunt down and kill Bourne. Now, these two trusted friends are on a deadly collision course.

Heartache Falls by Emily March - Married for more than twenty years, and with her children out of the nest, Ali Timberlake has come to Eternity Springs alone. She's looking for answers to heartbreaking questions and searching for something that's missing deep within herself. Taking a lease on the Bristlecone Cafe in pursuit of a lifelong dream, Ali feels revitalized as she becomes part of this charming mountain town. But a big piece of her is still back in Denver with her husband, Mac, a successful judge--and a man who isn't going to let the woman he loves leave without a fight. When Mac shows up in Eternity Springs--sexy, seductive, and determined to win his wife back--he experiences the wonder of the place that has given Ali such feelings of happiness and belonging. He wants that for her, but even more, he wants that with her. Ali has found a special place for her heart. But is there still enough room left in that heart for him?

#### **Young Adult Fiction**

The Final Warning: A Maximum Ride Novel by James Patterson. Maximum Ride is a perfectly normal teenager who just happens to be able to fly, the result of an out-of-control government experiment. Max and the other members of the Flock—six kids who share her remarkable ability—have been asked to aid a group of environmental scientists studying the causes of global warming. Their ability to fly could help the scientists conquer this epic problem. The expedition seems like a perfect combination of adventure, activism—and escaping government forces who watch the Flock like a hawk. But even in Antarctica, trapped in the harshest weather on our planet, Maximum Ride is an irresistible target in constant danger. For whoever controls her powers could also control the world.

### TRUST FUND

he Union Township Friends of the Library has established a trust fund with the Branch County Community Foundation to support non-operational activities of the library. This will not only pay for the arts & crafts activities for the kids, but also paid programming such as puppet shows, visits from the Kalamazoo Nature Center, the Red Cross babysitting class, Drummunity, building nest boxes and other classes and events put on at the library. The money will be invested by the Foundation to provide a continuous source of revenue for library activities. Except in the case of extraordinary circumstances, such as building remodeling or expansion, only the earnings and not the principle of the trust fund will be used to pay for activities. Donations of any amount may be given to the Union Township Friends of the Library and turned in at the library.
